Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 20, 2024



To celebrate St. Luke's Feast Day, we have a painting of St. Luke the Evangelist in his role as Patron Saint of Painters. Here St. Luke sits before a painting of the Virgin and Child he has just completed (with the aid of divine inspiration suggested by the angel in the background). There is a legend that he was the first and only person to have ever captured the likeness of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is a Baroque painting emblematic of the Catholic Counter Reformation movement, indicated by the Evangelist's gesture *toward* the image and *away* from the book (his Gospel) behind him on the table beneath a statue of an Ox. The Ox is St. Luke's attribute because he stressed the sacrificial aspects of Christ's life for our redemption. The artist Guercino has St. Luke gesture toward the image not to belittle the text of the gospel, but rather to indicate the important role that devotional art plays in the Church's prayer life.

ST LUKE'S THANKSGIVING **PROGRAM - 2024**

It has been a long-standing tradition at St Luke's to provide assistance to those in need at Thanksgiving. In the past, we have provided two bags of groceries as well as a grocery card. This year, in order to better meet the needs of our families. Outreach will change things up a bit. Most of the families that come to St Luke's for help receive a monthly SNAP card (formally known as Food Stamps) to get groceries. What many don't realize is that with a SNAP card, you cannot purchase diapers, wipes, detergent, soap, toothpaste, cleaning supplies etc. So, this year we will be asking our kids in the religious ed classes to (instead of food) bring in some of these essential items. Each family will receive a number of these items as well as a \$50. grocery card. Due to inflation, and the increasing number of immigrants who have come to Westboro, the need is greater than ever. More and more families in our community continue to face financial insecurity. It is my hope that we can ease their burden a bit this Thanksgiving. Typically, we provide for about 135 families which means that just the grocery cards alone cost over \$6,000.

- 2. Make a donation in any amount to help defray the cost of food cards. Checks can be made out to St Luke's Outreach with Thanksgiving in the memo. They can be dropped off at the Parish Center, or mailed to St Luke's Outreach, 1 Ruggles St.
- 3. Go online to **We Share** and make a donation by choosing "Thanksgiving".

Dear Parishioners,

July 1st marked my second year as pastor of St. Luke Parish. It has been an exciting time and a wonderful blessing to my ministry.

I was blessed to receive a strong, well-established community with solid physical and spiritual foundations from my predecessors.

My job as a pastor also includes some responsibilities with the administration of the Parish. Therefore, as steward of the Parish buildings, I must take care of and maintain our Parish Church, Parish Center, the Rectory, and the Cemetery.

In the past few years, we have replaced the roof on the Parish Center, structurally repaired our leaning bell tower, and renovated the kitchen in the Rectory. This summer, we repaired the parking lot behind the Parish Center. We want to keep this tradition of stewardship and care going forward.

After prayer and careful consideration, I would like to introduce the St. Luke's Grand Annual, as a way to keep up with the ongoing needs of Parish Church.

Among the projects we have identified with some approximate costs are:

Church Roof. (\$55.000)

Church Exterior, Windows painting, cleaning, and repair. (\$62.000)

Campus Sidewalk repairs. (\$33.000)

Church, Parish Center, and Garage electrical upgrades and repair. (\$40.000)

Church Choir Loft Safety Rail. (\$5.000)

Church Signage. (\$25.000)

Security Access Control in the Parish Center and Rectory. (\$30.000)

Parish Center Drainage System. (\$10.000)

Cemetery Plumber Repairs. (\$15.000)

Administration-Software updates and Cybersecurity System. (\$5.000)

Our Building and Ground Staff and the Finance Committee will review the repairs needed every year.

This is a Parish Campaign, and all the funds will be used in our Parish.

I believe this campaign will be a great opportunity for us to continue the work of evangelization.
