

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 27, 2024

Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man, saving to him, "Take courage; get up, he is calling you." He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way. Mark 10:49-52



Today's painting illustrates the moment in our gospel today when Christ heals the blind man of Jericho. We have seen artwork previously by Carl Bloch, a Danish artist, who is known for avoiding overt symbolic religious imagery and instead attempts to illustrate how he imagined a particular scene really might have appeared. However, despite this there remains rich symbolism in the picture. In the foreground we have Christ, who is *the light*, and has been brought to the area of the blind beggar. Christ emerges from the brightest part of the scene and walks into the darkest (what looks like an alley way). Thus, this darkest part of the painting symbolizes the darkness of sin and ignorance. The blind beggar resides in this literal and metaphorical space of darkness, yet through his strong faith and desire to 'see' Christ he yearns for salvation. Others behind them look on in yearning anticipation, while those further shrouded in darkness on the left foreground, likely Pharisees, look on the scene with great skepticism.



ST LUKE'S THANKSGIVING PROGRAM – 2024

It has been a long-standing tradition at St Luke's to provide assistance to those in need at Thanksgiving. In the past, we have provided two bags of groceries as well as a grocery card. This year, in order to better meet the needs of our families. Outreach will change things up a bit. Most of the families that come to St Luke's for help receive a monthly SNAP card (formally known as Food Stamps) to get groceries. What many don't realize is that with a SNAP card, you cannot purchase diapers, wipes, detergent, soap, toothpaste, cleaning supplies etc. So, this year we will be asking our kids in the religious ed classes to (instead of food) bring in some of these essential items. Each family will receive a number of these items as well as a \$50. grocery card. Due to inflation, and the increasing number of immigrants who have come to Westboro, the need is greater than ever. More and more families in our community continue to face financial insecurity. It is my hope that we can ease their burden a bit this Thanksgiving. Typically, we provide for about 135 families which means that just the grocery cards alone cost over \$6,000.

HOW YOU CAN HELP:

- 1.Donating a \$50. grocery card. (The most asked for are Walmart, Stop & Shop and Market Basket.)
- 2. Make a donation in any amount to help defray the cost of food cards. Checks can be made out to St Luke's Outreach with Thanksgiving in the memo. They can be dropped off at the Parish Center, or mailed to St Luke's Outreach, 1 Ruggles St.
- 3. Go online to **We Share** and make a donation by choosing "Thanksgiving".

Thank you for all the support you have given this program in the past, and we encourage your support again this year!


