# EPIPHANY OF THE LORD January 5, 2025

After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way. Matthew 2:9-12



Today's painting is by one of the truly great Spanish masters, Diego Velázquez. Originally from Seville, he became the official royal court painter to the King of Spain in Madrid and is still considered one of the greatest portraitists of all time. We celebrate the Epiphany today, which highlights the visit by the three Magi (or "Three Kings"). Velazquez, a Baroque painter, prepared a dynamic composition establishing a diagonal from the lower left corner to the upper right for what was likely an altarpiece due to its large size (6'8"x4'1"). On the left we see the three Magi wearing contemporary Spanish clothing: Balthasar wears a red mantle (with an unknown youth behind him), Caspar kneels wearing black, and Melchior kneels before the Christ child in the foreground. All three offer their gifts of gold (symbolizing Christ's Kingship), frankincense (symbolizing his divinity) and myrrh (symbolizing his humanity). Joseph kneels to the right of the Blessed Virgin. All figures are based on real models and Velazquez highlights Christ's divinity by allowing only his face to be free of any shade or shadows. On the bottom right there is a plant with thorns foreshadowing Christ's Passion.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On Christmas Eve, Pope Francis will open and enter the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica to celebrate Christmas Mass and begin a Jubilee Year.

A Jubilee Year is a special time of remission of sin and punishment due to sin. It involves pilgrimages, prayer, and works of mercy and penance. Jubilee Years awaken in us a profound awareness of the depth of God's love, mercy and solicitude for each one of us. That deepened awareness leads to a greater hope of sharing in the glory of God (Romans 5:2).

At Christmas, the glory of God briefly shone down on quaking shepherds tending their flocks as angels announced good news of great joy: God's

Eternal Son was born of the Virgin Mary. Through the Holy Spirit, He took on our lowly humanity that we might forever share in the glory of His divinity. As Jesus was fully God and fully man, no one can claim that God is distant from us, or unaware of our trials. He walked among us and died for us. He is that close. He cares that much. This gives us hope throughout life and in every circumstance of life. Pope Francis has called us "Pilgrims of Hope" as the theme for this year's Jubilee. It is a hope that will not disappoint because it is based in Jesus Christ who is the Eternal Word of God made flesh.

The New Year 2025 is not only a Jubilee Year, but an anniversary year. It is the 1900th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, which defined the dogma of the divinity of Jesus Christ as true God and true man. It is also the 75th Anniversary of the founding of the Diocese of Worcester, for which we give thanks. 2025 will be a year full of opportunities for grace, hope and joy. They all stem from the Son of God and Son of Mary who was born in Bethlehem. I pray that you and your loved ones will have a blessed Christmas and that the observances and celebrations of 2025 will prolong those joys, deepen your faith and strengthen your hope.


# St Luke's Grand Annual Update

As Father Diego and Father Sagar shared at Mass, the 2024 Grand Annual Fundraiser for facility repairs was a tremendous success with total collections exceeding \$150,000!

The most pressing project, the repair/renovation of our leaking Church roof, is underway. With support from the Worcester Diocese, we have hired a professional engineering firm to evaluate the condition of the building and work with potential contractors to identify our options. We expect the results back from this process in January.

Progress on two other projects is being made. First, as many of you are aware, we have had several incidents at our Church and on the Parish Center grounds recently. Installation of a video overwatch system in the Parish Center is complete and we expect to install a similar system for our Church in January. These systems will enable us to remotely monitor building entrances/exits 24 hours a day and in real-time. Second, a group of parish volunteers has been working for some months with the Town of Westborough to design new, conforming, Church building signage that will both identify the building for emergency personnel as well provide up-to-date information about Church Masses.
