There is much about St. Luke that makes it a special parish, but what I find most exceptional is the generosity and commitment to helping those in need. BRIEF HISTORY LINE OF OUR PARISH

1834 The earliest recorded Catholic service in the town of Westborough was celebrated by a inissionary priest, **Father Fitton**, who later founded The College of the Holy Cross.

1869 Old Baptist church was purchased by Father Barry and moved to Milk Street.

1886 On April 4, 1886, the converted church burned to the

1851-1855 Westborough was established as a mission. Services were held in local homes.

1870 Westborough was officially established as a parish, with Father Richard Donovan as its first pastor.

1888-1889 Under the supervision of the pastor, **Father John J. McCoy**, a new wood frame church in the Romanesque style was built on the corner of West Main and Ruggles Streets. The new church was dedicated on August 1, 1889.

1920-1921 Parish church burned to the ground (again!). Under the leadership of Father John D. McGann, the present brick structure (as we know and love it today) was built and dedicated.

1975 The Stone property at the corner of Cross and Ruggles Street was purchased and made into much needed parking space adjacent to the Parish Center.

1969 The parish center was completed and dedicated during the pastorate of Father Raymond Burke.

1980 The original Victorian styled home that had served as a rectory for many years was removed and the present parish house was built on the corner of West Main and Charles Streets during the ministry of **Father Leo Barry**. At this time the current ramp for the handicapped was also installed at the church entrance.

the Parish Center and the people of St. Luke's celebrated the 125th anniversary of the parish community.

1994 The interior of the church was completely renovated during the tenure of Father George Lange and was solemnly dedicated by Bishop Timothy J. Harrington at a con-celebrated Mass on September 18.

2000 In 2000, parish records showed 5,371 people registered at St. Luke's there were 567 people over 65 and 610 children under the age of 7. Total parish mailing at that time was approximately 1,900 families or individuals in Westborough, Northboro, Shrewsbury, Marlboro, Hopkinton and Grafton.

2025 The Parish reported around 77 new families registered. In total, the community is made of more than 1,800 families.

Did you know...?



The Gospel of Luke is one of the four canonical Gospels and, along with the Gospels of Matthew and Mark, is one of the synoptic Gospels. Despite the similarities with these three Gospels, Luke has a unique character and language. It is recognized first, as the Gospel of the Holy Spirit, due to the multiple mentions and actions of the Holy Spirit present in the different stories.

Also, the Gospel of Luke presents a particular concern for the poor, presenting some of the most direct and striking of Jesus' teachings about the dangers of wealth and God's love for the poor.

Here are the stories we can find only in Luke's gospel:

Birth and Childhood of Jesus:

The narrative of Jesus' birth and childhood, including the Annunciation, the visit to the temple at age 12, and the census, is found only in Luke.

Parables:

Luke contains several famous parables not found in the other Gospels, such as:



- The Good Samaritan
- The Prodigal Son
- The Rich Man and Lazarus
- The Good Samaritan
- The Lost Coin
- The Pharisee and the Tax Collector



Jesus' Ministry:

- The Sermon on the Plain
- The healing of the woman who was bent over for 18 years
- The healing of the ten lepers
- The mission of the 72 disciples
- Jesus' weeping over Jerusalem





Crucifixion and Resurrections

- Jesus' prayer for His executioners: "Father, forgive them."
- The conversation with the penitent thief: "Today you will be with me in paradise."
- Jesus' ascension to heaven from Bethany
- The post-resurrection appearance on the road to Emmaus
