The Resurrection ~ Faith

You need not be amazed! You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, the one who was crucified. He has been raised up; He is not here. See the place where they laid Him.

(Mark 16:6)

2. The Ascension ~ Hope

Then, after speaking to them, the Lord Jesus was taken up into Heaven and took His seat at God's right hand.

(Mark 16:19)

3. The Descent of the Holy Spirit ~ Love of God

All were filled with the Holy Spirit. They began to express themselves in foreign tongues and make bold proclamation as the Spirit prompted them.

(Acts 2:4)

4. The Assumption of Our Lady ~ Grace of a happy death

into Heaven You are the glory of Jerusalem ... you are the splendid boast of our people ... God is pleased with what you have wrought. May you be blessed by the Lord Almighty forever and ever.

(Judith 15:9-10)

5. The Coronation ~ Trust in Mary's intercession

A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars.

(Revelation 12:1)



1. Baptism of Jesus ~ Openness to the Holy Spirit

And when Jesus was baptized, ... the heavens were opened and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove, and alighting on Him, and lo, a voice from heaven, saying "this is My beloved Son," with whom I am well pleased."

(Matthew 3:16-17)

2. Wedding at Cana ~ To Jesus through Mary

His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever He tells you." ... Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim.

(John 2:5-7)

3. Proclaiming the Kingdom ~ Repentance & trust In God

"And preach as you go, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons. You received without pay, give without pay."

(Matthew 10:7-8)

4. Transfiguration ~ Desire for holiness

And as He was praying, the appearance of His countenance was altered and His raiment become dazzling white. And a voice came out of the cloud saying, "This is My Son, My chosen; listen to Him!"

(Luke 9:29, 35)

5. Institution of the Eucharist ~ Adoration

And He took bread, and when He had given thanks He broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you." ... And likewise the cup after supper, saying, "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood."

(Luke 22:19-20)



1. The Annunciation ~ Humiliation

And when the angel had come to her, he said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women."

(Luke 1:28)

2. Visitation ~ Love of neighbor

Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and cried out in a loud voice: "Blest are you among women and blest is the fruit of your womb."

(Luke 1:41-42)

3. The Birth of Jesus ~ Poverty

She gave birth to her first-born Son and wrapped Him in swaddling clothes and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the place where travelers lodged.

(Luke 2:7)

4. The Presentation ~ Obedience

When the day came to purify them according to the law of Moses, the couple brought Him up to Jerusalem so that He could be presented to the Lord, for it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every first-born male shall be consecrated to the Lord."

(Luke 2:22-23)

5. Finding the Child Jesus in the Temple ~ Joy of finding Jesus

On the third day they came upon Him in the temple sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions.

(Luke 2:46)



1. The Agony in the Garden ~ Sorrow for sin

He was in such agony and he prayed so fervently that his sweat became like drops of blood falling on the ground. When he rose from prayer and returned to his disciples, he found them sleeping from grief.

(Luke 22: 44:45)

2. The Scourging at the Pillar ~ Purity

Pilate's next move was to take Jesus and have Him scourged.

(John 19:1)

3. Crowning with Thorns ~ Courage

They stripped off His clothes and wrapped Him in a scarlet military cloak. Weaving a crown out of thorns they fixed it on His head, and stuck a reed in His right hand ...

(Matthew 27:28-29)

4. Carrying of the Cross ~ Patience

... carrying the cross by Himself, He went out to what is called the Place of the Skull (in Hebrew, Golgotha)

(John 19:17)

5. The Crucifixion ~ Perseverance

Jesus uttered a loud cry and said, "Father, into Your hands I commend My spirit." After He said this, He expired.

(Luke 23:46)
