Advent Novena at the Seminary



St. Peter Canisius

Peter Canisius was among the earliest Jesuits to make a solemn profession of vows. In 1580 he was assigned to the Catholic city of Fribourg, where he founded a famous university and almost single-handedly preserved the Catholic presence in Switzerland. At a time when vicious defamation was commonly traded between opposing sides of the Reformation, Canisius maintained a tone of charity and generosity toward his opponents. In every city where he worked he was active in promoting Catholic printers and publishers. This contribution was especially emphasized by Pope Pius XI when in 1925 he canonized Peter Canisius and named him a Doctor of the Church. Blessed Among Us – Give Us This Day

The Pastor's Workshop

Some of you may be familiar with the 'O' Antiphons. Beginning December 17-23, the universal church has celebrated the special descriptions of the coming Messiah for 7 successive nights. I'm sure you're familiar with the last one, O come O come Emmanuel.....but the other ones are distinctive too.



O Wisdom, O Adonai (Lord), O Root of Jesse, O Key of David, O Rising Sun, O Key of the nations, Emmanuel are the first words prior to the Magnificat that is prayed at evening prayer, the week before Christmas by the Catholic Church. It has been part of church's liturgy since the 8th century! These

titles describe well our hopes during Advent. Maybe each night before dinner you can pray the proper prayer as an intro to your meal prayer.

December 17

O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!

December 18

O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!

December 19

O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!

December 20

O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!

December 21

O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

December 22

O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

December 23

O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!
