Friendly Reminder

Before Mass there should be a general atmosphere of silence. This does not exclude a quiet word of greeting, a nod of recognition or a friendly handshake among the parishioners. What should be avoided is the steadily rising hum of multiple conversations in the pews.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, in No. 45, says: "Even before the celebration itself, it is commendable that silence is to be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred action in a devout and fitting manner."

After Mass, the most charitable approach is to quietly leave the main body of the Church so as to facilitate the recollection of those who wish to extend their personal thanksgiving for Communion. This quiet is similar to the situation before Mass as it does not exclude a friendly greeting. But actual conversation should not begin until outside.

pick an item for a child and purchase it. The Giving Trees will go up on November 22^{nd} and gifts will be collected no later than December 10, 2023.


Missionary Discipleship – Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe - *The Last Things*
