The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Sunday, June 6, 2021

From Fr. Mark

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, (formerly called the Feast of Corpus Christi).

In today's passage from the Gospel of Mark, we hear the words of Jesus, who said at the Last Supper: "Take it; this is my body." and "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many."

Every time we celebrate the Mass, the priest prays these words of Jesus. These words from the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke are called the "institution narratives".

We believe that the Word of God is powerful and creative. When the priest prays these words over the bread and wine, we believe these elements become the Body and Blood of Jesus. This goes beyond a mere memorial ritual, or a symbolic gesture. We believe the bread and wine, though they look like bread and wine on the surface, actually have been transformed by the power of Jesus' words prayed by the priest. The core substance of the bread and wine has been transformed. We call this "transubstantiation". We believe the Eucharist is a sacrifice which strengthens and nourishes our community life, and is an act of worship and thanksgiving. Eucharist literally means "thanksgiving". We are grateful to God for the ongoing presence of Jesus Christ within us through the receiving of the Body and Blood of Jesus.

This teaching about the Eucharist being the Real Presence of Jesus is a central belief of our Catholic faith. The Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is the hub, or center, of our seven Sacraments. May we always be grateful for the gift of the Eucharist in our lives!

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Reading I

Ex 24:3-8

When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the LORD, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." Moses then wrote down all the words of the LORD and, rising early the next day, he erected at the foot of the mountain an altar and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then, having sent certain young men of the Israelites to offer holocausts and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings to the LORD, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar. Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people, who answered, "All that the LORD has said, we will heed and do." Then he took the blood and sprinkled it on the people, saying, "This is the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words of his."

Heb 9:11-15

Brothers and sisters:
When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption.

For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God. For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

Gospel

Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"' Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.


