PASTOR'S REFLECTION

Dear Friends,

The nearness of God is amazing! He is near to us through the beauty of nature, through Scripture, through the Sacraments, through one another, and ultimately through His Incarnation which we prepare to celebrate at Christmas.



God's nearness is also palpable through the nearness of Mary, our Mother. This week we celebrate her miraculous nearness in her appearance on December 12 as Our Lady of Guadalupe. The appearance of Mary in Mexico in 1531 is a miracle that cannot be debunked, as the miraculous image created by her appearance is still in existence today! (We have a replica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in our church to the right of the sanctuary.)

On Thursday morning all are invited to a traditional Mexican custom called "Las Mañanitas" at 5am here in the church. The celebration begins with a brief dramatization of the miracle, rosary, mariachi music, and then a light breakfast in the cafeteria. If you've never attended this annual event, this year you should come!

May Our Lady of Guadalupe intercede for us all in this holy season of Advent!



Father John Riley, a priest of the Diocese of Arlington, has been on loan to the Archdiocese of Denver since 2010, serving as chaplain and professor at the Augustine Institute. After attending the University of Notre Dame, Fr Riley discerned a call to the priesthood, and earned degrees from St Charles Borromeo Seminary and the Notre Dame Pontifical Catechetical Institute. He served as chaplain and professor at Christendom College from 1995 to 2000. In addition to his service to the Augustine Institute, Fr Riley taught spiritual theology at St John Vianney Seminary, offered courses to and through the Denver Biblical School and Catechetical School, and has also offered courses, retreats, and days of recollection for a number of parishes, as well as for Catholic Charities of Denver, Christ in the City, the Fellowship of Catholic University Students, the Denver Archdiocesan Communications Office, the Poor Clare Nuns of Roswell, New Mexico, and the Missionaries of Charity in Calcutta. Fr Riley’s primary effort is rooted in the hope of seeing the full flower of the New Evangelization firmly grounded in the Heart of Catechesis – Jesus Christ.





Our Lady of Guadalupe



In the image, Our Lady wears a blue-green mantle covered with stars. The stars are in a pattern that show the exact position of the constellations in the Mexican sky on December 12, 1531, the day the image appeared on the tilma, but the patterns are "in reverse", as if being viewed from above them and looking down toward the earth. Our Lady also wears a pale red gown overlayed with golden flowers. The flowers are in a pattern that coincides with the major mountain ranges of central Mexico.

Our Lady's image was measured by a gynecologist who determined that the dimensions of her body indicated a pregnant woman who was due to give birth very soon. Considering that the unveiling of the image occurred on December 12, approximately 2 weeks remained until the day that the birth of Jesus is celebrated in the Catholic Church, December 25. A stethoscope was placed beneath the black sash Our Lady was wearing (a symbol of pregnancy). Rhythmic repeated heartbeats were heard at a rate of 115 beats per minute, the same as the heartbeat of a baby in the womb.


Multiple scientists have examined Our Lady's image on the tilma over the last 500 years. There is no trace of paint or brush strokes and the fabric has not been treated in any way. No natural animal, vegetable or mineral colorings can be identified. The colors actually "float" 1/100th of an inch above the surface of the cloth without touching it. They have an iridescent quality in that the colors change slightly depending on the angle from which the image is viewed. In 1979, a NASA professor determined that there was no explanation for the permanence of the colors or their vividness after 5 centuries have passed.

The colors should have deteriorated many years ago, but the quality of the image is exactly as it was in 1531.

One of the most fascinating aspects of Our Lady's image on the tilma is her eyes. Photographs of her image have been taken and enlarged in order to study her eyes. One ophthalmologist enlarged the image of Our Lady's eyes 2,500 times and discovered 13 figures, all of those present on December 12, 1531 when Juan Diego opened his tilma, dropping the flowers to the floor and exposing Our Lady's image. The images in her eyes are a reflection of what actually occurred at that moment, including the astonished expression of the bishop and other witnesses. (Excerpt from www.saintantoninus.org)




A Biblical Walk Through the Mass (Wednesday Nights)




