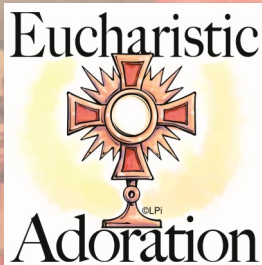

## SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY** Contact the office at least six months in advance for an appointment. A definite Wedding Date will be set only after preparations are underway.

**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM** Register and worship with us at least 3 months prior to Baptism. Parents must be registered. Godparents must be registered, receive communion regularly, be confirmed Catholics, and not be cohabiting with a partner outside the blessings of a Catholic marriage. Call office for more information and class dates.

**SACRAMENTS OF FIRST EUCHARIST/RECONCILIATION & CONFIRMATION** Preparation of children and youth for receiving first Eucharist, Reconciliation and/or Confirmation is a 2 Yr. process. Students MUST have good Mass and class attendance in the catechetical year. Speak with the Religious Education Coordinator or class catechist if you have questions.

## Dear Padre

### What is the Catholic belief in the Real Presence of the Eucharist?

Our belief in the Real Presence goes back to Jesus himself. Saint Paul describes the Last Supper: Jesus took bread and said, "This is my body." He took wine and said, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood." The Catholic Church has always believed that Jesus meant exactly what he said.

When confronted, Jesus did not water down his statements, although they were difficult to accept and beyond human understanding. Even Peter did not claim to understand. He simply accepted them on the authority of Jesus, who had "the words of eternal life."

Catholics have always believed in the Real Presence of Jesus, known traditionally as transubstantiation. This means that the "substance" of the bread and wine becomes the "substance" of Christ's Body and Blood, while the appearances of bread and wine remain. When we receive Communion, we truly receive the Body and Blood, soul and divinity, of Christ, under the appearance of bread and wine (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1373-1381).

Not all Christians believe in the Eucharist as Catholics do. Some deny that Christ is present at all, contending that the bread and wine only symbolize the spirit and teachings of Jesus. There are many variations, and Catholics should carefully distinguish our Church's teaching from other opinions.

Bread and wine are changed by Christ into himself in a miracle of love we Catholics call, with awe and affection, the Blessed Sacrament.

We missed you all last time and we want to try again. We encourage you to join us for our second try as we give back to our community and participate in the corporal works of mercy as the youth of St. Eleanor.

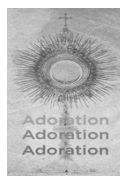
