PASTOR’S CORNER

Pride is a very tricky sin. It might be the most difficult sin because it is kind of a “back door” for Satan to get at us. With many other sins, things are pretty obvious when they are wicked. Many sins come about because we commit an evil action. We lie, we speak ill of someone,

we abuse alcohol. However, Pride can come about precisely when we avoid sin! This makes it one of the most dangerous sins. What if I don't lie, I almost never speak ill of others, and I don't abuse alcohol. Man, I'm doing pretty good! I'm a swell guy! Why do I need to go to confession? I think I'm set to go!

Pride can even hit harder with a faithful Catholic. I go to Mass; I give to the parish; I help out at the soup kitchen; I give of my time! Wow I'm doing great!! It's when we are doing the best things that pride can strike!

Also, pride can be a particular difficulty when evangelizing here in Alaska. I'm doing pretty well! I don't need God right now!

In our Gospel this Sunday, we hear the familiar story of the pharisee and the publican (tax collector). It can be easy for us to see the pride in the pharisee. However, the actions that he's done are good! He tries to avoid sin. He also pays tithes and fasts. Those are all very good things that can help keep us in relationship with God. But then he makes some fatal moves. First, he distains the sinner. As St. John Chrysostom points out about this passage, one doesn't grow in holiness by trashing someone else. The Pharisee doesn't leave any room for God or His mercy because the Pharisee thinks he's already holy – and by his own power!!!

However, the Publican knows he has sinned and relies on the Divine Mercy. He becomes the saint, whereas the seemingly good Pharisee commits fatal sins!

Those of us who are committed Catholic Christians must be vigilant against pride. There are many ways to do this. We should make a regular habit of confession accompanied by a good examination of conscience. It would also do us well to remember the dignity of each and every human life – including those who might be hardened or notorious sinners, and to pray for their conversion.

Also, we should be aware of pride in those who feel that they simply do not need God. This is a particular problem for evangelizing in the last frontier. The “do it yourself” mentality is really great for a pioneer, great for a homesteader, and is really great for someone seeking solitude. However, in terms of salvation, the “do it yourself” mentality simply cannot save us. We need God! We need to acknowledge that He is not merely a therapist or a problem solver. He is the savior of the world! We are reliant upon Him for salvation – to become Saints! *Siempre Adelante!!*
