
PASTOR'S CORNER

There is a narrative often put forward by our separated brethren in the Christian faith that the emperor Constantine founded the Catholic Church. When he founded the Catholic Church, he constructed grand churches and put into them images. The implication of this is that before Constantine the church only met in Continued on next page

underground communities and therefore did not have grand or ornately decorated churches. Indeed, for many of our separated brethren, they regularly worship in spaces that resemble a convention hall or a theatre.



There is a major problem with this entire narrative. Obviously, if one studies the Acts of the Apostles and non-biblical documents from early Christianity, we see the Catholic Church in its nascent form. That Constantine narrative is simply false – Jesus Christ is the founder of His church!

There is also a problem with the narrative with regard to building churches. We have archeological sites of the catacombs and house churches – places where the underground church worshiped. Here's the thing – they were decorated! From the earliest times, Christians have adorned their churches with images of the Lord, the Blessed Mother, and the Saints! These images were meant not only for beauty, but also for catechesis – to teach about the mysteries of salvation. These images were also meant to help open people's hearts to Christ – for deepening evangelization and conversion!

Today we celebrate the feast day of the Dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome. It is actually the Cathedral Church of Rome (St. Peter's basilica is not the cathedral!). Because of the association of the Lateran as the Pope's Cathedral, it is referred to by the title *mater et caput* — mother and head of all of the churches in the world. Because of this, the feast day outranks the Sundays of Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar. We rejoice with the whole church in celebrating the dedication of the Pope's Cathedral!

However, in today's second reading, we hear that we are living stones. We are the stones that make up the church! This has caused some Catholic priests to opine that this feast really isn't about a building, but about the people, the living stones instead.

But why does it have to be either or?

The Catholic Church does have beautiful buildings, and we encourage the building of more beautiful buildings and consecrating them for divine worship! However, the Church is not just the curator of historical and beautiful buildings. The reason we build and maintain beautiful buildings is to win souls for Christ!

Let us care for our own church building, too – and pray that we can make it even more beautiful! Please pray, too, for the many people over the last few months who have been coming to our church building here in Anchorage who have never been to a Catholic church before – or haven't been for years and years. Pray for their ongoing conversion! Pray that our buildings and liturgy will help form saints! *Siempre Adelante*!


