As the successor of St. Peter, Pope Leo XIV reminds us: "We must remember what it is to be a missionary church" - to declare the Truth

to the world, as all the Apostles did, in union with Peter, who is the head of the Church, and Paul, with his missionary zeal. Missionary zeal in union with the head of the church is as central to evangelization in the 21st century as it was in the 1st.

What does this mean for us? How can we continue the mission of these two great Fathers of our Faith?

In the gospel of Matthew, Jesus asks the Apostles "Who do you say that I am?" When all fell silent, a voice spoke out authoritatively amongst them and said, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus answered the voice and said, "You are Peter, and upon this rock I build my church." Peter declared that indispensable Truth, which is the very foundation of our faith. We, too, have received the necessary gifts to go forth and declare this Truth about Christ; namely with those virtues which were divinely infused in us at our Baptism - Faith, Hope and Charity.

This question that Christ asked the Apostles remains relevant for us today. Many people in the world, and even some who identify as Christian, declare our Lord Jesus to be someone that He is not, as someone less than the Almighty God; whose Church holds the fullness of Truth on earth.

But there is good news and reason to have hope! The foundations of Truth have already been laid by those who came before us in faith. The answer has already been authoritatively given by Peter and confirmed by Christ. The call to proclaim this Truth, which is the only Truth, to the ends of the earth is where we come in. While the foundations have been laid, the call remains and Christ's work in us, the Church, is not yet finished.

As we go about our daily lives, in our vocations and jobs, it is important not to lose sight of this call: to be the voice that speaks out in the silence of our peers, the one that stands up and proclaims the Truth of Christ. Though we will face obstacles along the way, as Peter did, when time and time again his faith faltered, we must choose, as Peter did, to return and persevere on the path to Sainthood and strive to declare with missionary zeal, in union with the Church, that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God! *Siempre Adelante*!



Change of age and grade level for the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

May the grace and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

The grace and strength received from the sacraments of the Church are essential for every Catholic to lead a good Christian life, joyfully witnessing to the Gospel and defending the Catholic faith we hold dear.

The sacraments of Christian initiation - Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist - lay the foundations of every Christian life. "The sharing in the divine nature given to men through the grace of Christ bears a certain likeness to the origin, development, and nourishing of natural life. The faithful are born anew by Baptism, strengthened by the sacrament of Confirmation, and receive in the Eucharist the food of eternal life. By means of these sacraments of Christian initiation, they thus receive in increasing measure the treasures of the divine life and advance toward the perfection of charity." (Catechism of the Catholic Church – CCC – No. 1212)

Today's youth encounter numerous secular and anti-Christian influences at an earlier age than ever before. After consulting with the priests of the archdiocese and receiving their unanimous support, I am adjusting the age and grade for the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation in the archdiocese to 11 years of age and 5th grade. At this age and grade level, our youth are receptive to catechesis and parental guidance, and more will receive the sacrament.

This change begins today. The goal is for every parish to implement fully the change by the 2028 Easter season. The Easter season is fifty days, starting on Easter and concluding on Pentecost.

The pastors will determine how to ensure that individuals aged 11 and older who have not yet received the sacrament of Confirmation may do so after receiving catechesis and formation.

On October 30, 2024, while greeting a group of newly confirmed, Pope Francis prayed that the Holy Spirit would "inflame your hearts and make you joyful witnesses for Christ."
