

This past week, I've been reading the first published biography of Pope Leo XIV. I'm amazed that so many of the Catholic institutions



he was a part of as a child have closed - the hospital where he was born, the parish that he was baptized in and grew up in, the elementary school he attended, the high school seminary he went to – all gone. All of them have fallen victim to a state of managed decline that so many Catholic parishes and institutions have been in the last 65 years or so. These are the results of demographic shifts as neighborhoods change, depopulation of cities, and, perhaps most scary, a general decline in religious practice in the United States.

However, we have the opposite experience for our Parish here at Holy Family where we are growing and hoping to expand more! This is the case for all of our Dominican Parishes up and down the west coast at this time. We are not in a state of managed decline – we are growing and thriving! This coincides with a renewed interest in religion – especially traditional religious practice, among Gen Z.

Part of this renewal is the fact that the Dominican Order has been growing in the United States of America recently. We now have incredible growth in all 4 US provinces of men. We also see the increase in vocations in a number of our Sisters' congregations. Fundraising has concentrated on this as we need resources to house, educate, and generally form our new vocations!!

In this Sunday's gospel the Lord laments that the harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Then he sends out the 72 disciples in pairs to preach the word.

This week, we have the privilege of hosting our Novices for the Western Dominican Province. These young men are completing their first year of formation as Dominicans, and, as part of that initial formation, they come to all of the ministry sites. As part of this experience, we've introduced them to many aspects of the Parish. They will share their vocation stories at all of the Masses this weekend. On Monday, we'll head up to Trapper Creek and Talkeetna so that they will get a little more experience of Mission Alaska.

Please come on Tuesday evening to the Dominican Forum at 7p.m. when the Novices will share all of their vocation stories and also answer questions. Their experiences and stories are a microcosm of the world we live in now. Their stories also give us insight into what inspires the young today to not only stay faithful, but to embrace even more deeply the Catholic faith!

Pray for more vocations to the priesthood! Pray, too, for more holy vocations to the married life – especially here at Holy Family! Pray that our parish might stay vibrant and be a light for the people of the last frontier! *Siempre Adelante*!
