# **PASTOR'S CORNER**

You've heard me harp over and over again that "being good is not enough – we are called to be Saints." I do this because the common view is that all we need to really do to be a Christian is to do good things for the needy. One example that is often cited for this is the example of the "good Samaritan." The prevailing view is that the most important thing is not to be a "religious person" like the priest and the Levite who ignores Continued on next page

the man in need, but to be like the foreigner who helps him. Now, obviously,



we are called to help those who are truly in need! However, it is not as simple as that to be a Christian – to do good things. In reality, we must do good things because we have had an encounter with Christ!!

We tend to think of a good Christian as the Good Samaritan – or at least to strive to be like him. That is our goal. However, the whole perspective on this parable changes if we put ourselves not in the position of the Samaritan, but in the position of the man who is wounded and left for dead.

A common ancient interpretation of this parable of the Good Samaritan is to see the Good Samaritan as actually Christ Himself! The man who has fallen victim to robbers represents us. The robbers represent satan and the demons. We have had our birthright stolen, and we are left for dead through sin and the devil. We are wounded and in need of healing. The Priest and the Levite represent the Old Testament. The Old Covenant can help in a sense - point us towards salvation, but it is only with the coming of God Himself in Christ that we can gain heaven. Jesus is the one who comes and lifts us up and takes us to the inn for healing. The inn represents the Church which is the field hospital for sinners – the place where we receive healing through the instrumentality of our brothers and sisters. The oil used to bathe the wounds represents the Holy Spirit, and the wine represents the cleansing power of the blood of Christ. Of course, both oil and wine point to the sacraments which are the premier fount of grace. The innkeeper represents St. Paul, who teaches us more fully the things of Christ. Finally, the coins symbolize many things including the many Graces that come from Christ through the Church!!

We have had an encounter with the Good Samaritan, that is Jesus Christ, and have been lifted up! We've had our sins washed away and been given to the care of the church! Now we must "go and do likewise." We must bring souls to Christ and the inn of the church! We must engage in corporal works of mercy because we've had an encounter with Christ! We must help others find that Grace which leads to heaven to become Saints! *Siempre Adelante*!!!
