### PARISH HEALTH MINISTRY

**“He who has ears to hear, let him hear.”**

**Luke 14:35**

Just a few statistics from the “Hearing Loss Association of America”

- **Approximately 48 million adults in the US report some degree of hearing loss.**
- **Hearing loss is a major public health issue that is the 3<sup>rd</sup> most common physical condition after arthritis and heart disease.**
- **In the US, 3 out of every 1000 children are born hard of hearing or deaf.**
- **In adults, the most common causes of hearing loss are noise and aging.**
- **Depression and isolation are common among those with hearing loss.**
- **Men are more likely to develop hearing loss than women.**
- **only 1 out of 5 people who could benefit from a hearing aid actually wears one.**

Take a moment over the next few months to read the info on the bulletin board in the dining hall regarding hearing loss/aids/troubleshooting/communication tips. Most of the info I got from the organization above-- “Hearing Loss Association of America”. It is a good web resource for more info on how to face the challenges of hearing loss ie: kit for hospital and medical care communication considerations, drivers license, hearing aid types, how to better communicate with someone who is hard of hearing/deaf.
