

# Change in life is inevitable.

GRIEF is "the instinctive human response to loss." Divorce, death, aging, and illness are examples of what may cause grief. We all grieve differently in our own rhythm of passing time. Grief vs mourning: grief is what we think and feel inside. Mourning is the outward expression of grief. Crying, telling stories, journaling, praying, and support groups are examples. Mourning, over time, is how we begin to **heal**.

In recent years, I have offered a DVD/booklet session, "Surviving the Holidays." It offers strategies, suggestions, and discussion on how to deal with grieving the loss of a loved one when holidays occur. I would like to know if anyone would be interested in attending this 1.5-2 hour session in the Fall. A sign-up sheet will be left in back of the Church in September.
