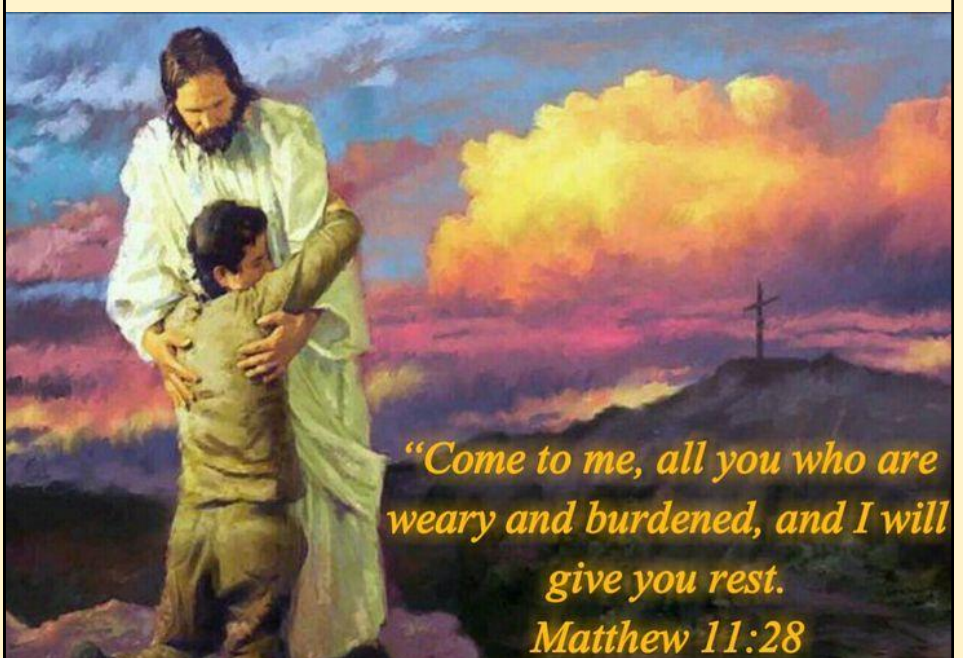

PARISH HEALTH MINISTRY

"Christ has no body on earth but ours, no hands, but ours, no feet, but ours. Ours are the eyes through which the compassion of Christ looks out upon the world. Ours are the feet with which He goes about doing good. Ours are the hands with which He blesses His people." St. Teresa of Avila.

In Archbishop Sample's letter, he asks that we perform one or more of the **CORPORAL** and **SPIRITUAL WORKS** of **MERCY** for the benefit of the poor and suffering. Every Christian has a calling and a responsibility to serve as a living example of Jesus' teachings – to serve one another. For Christians, young and old, service should be an attitude, a way of life. It is important not only to listen and understand the Word of God, but also to apply the lessons learned through daily life and service to others.

Below is a list of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy that fulfill Christ's mission of mercy." - (Good Shepherd Catholic Church)

The Corporal Works of Mercy recognize the sacredness of human life. We learn through fulfilling these Works of Mercy for others that we are our brother's keeper. Our feelings of love for our fellow man must be accompanied by acts of charity.

- 1) Feed the hungry. 2) Give drink to the thirsty.
- 3) Clothe the naked. 4) Shelter the homeless. 5) Visit those in prison.
- 6) Visit the sick. 7) Bury the dead.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy recognize sin, ignorance, doubt, sorrow, and other human conditions where we need to reach out in faith and love to others.

- 1) Convert/admonish sinners.
- 2) Instruct the ignorant/uninformed. 3) Counsel the doubtful. 4) Comfort the sorrowful/afflicted. 5) Bear wrongs patiently.
- 6) Forgive offenses/injuries. 7) Pray for the living and the dead.

the following **Works of Mercy**:
