**This Sunday's** first reading introduces us to the Servant, anointed and commissioned by God with special signs, who becomes the messenger of the good news of salvation to all people. In a way, the mission of John the Baptist narrated by Saint John in the Gospel reflects the Servant of Isaiah. John, however, clarifies for us that he is only a witness and not the Messiah announced since ancient times.

This Third Sunday of Advent invites us to celebrate with joy the near arrival of salvation. The Christian community is nourished by this announcement of good news and is challenged to do what is proclaimed and to reflect the message of the Gospel in their lives. Traditionally, this Sunday is known as "Gaudete" Sunday and, although it anticipates the birth of Jesus, liturgical coordinators should neither display Christmas decorations nor use Christmas carols.

**La primera** lectura de este domingo nos introduce al Siervo, ungido y comisionado por Dios con signos especiales, que se convierte en el mensajero de la buena nueva de la salvación a todas las personas. En cierto modo, la misión de Juan el Bautista narrada por San Juan en el

Evangelio refleja al Siervo de Isaías. Juan, sin embargo, nos aclara que él es sólo un testigo y no el Mesías anunciado desde tiempos antiguos.

Este tercer domingo de Adviento nos invita a celebrar con alegría la casi llegada de la salvación. La comunidad cristiana se nutre de este anuncio de buenas noticias y se ve desafiada a hacer lo que se proclama y a reflejar el mensaje del Evangelio en sus vidas. Tradicionalmente, este domingo se conoce como "Gaudete" el domingo y, aunque anticipa el nacimiento de Jesús, los coordinadores litúrgicos no deben exhibir decoraciones navideñas ni utilizar villancicos.

## From the Desk of Father Kurt

When someone who has suffered from an illness for a long time finds out the cause they are relieved, even though the prognosis might not be all that good. We want to know the truth even when it is hard to swallow, because the truth sets us free. John the Baptist spoke the hard truth about the consequences of sin and people still came to listen to him.

People are willing to listen to fraternal correction if it is spoken in love. However, too often we bring up the faults of others in conversations as a way for us to justify ourselves or make ourselves feel important. We would much rather think poorly of the other and spread the gossip, than to confront the person of their sin.

If we really love that person, we will not allow their sinful behavior to go unchallenged. However, before correcting the faults of others it is always a good idea to ask ourselves if we are guilty of the very same thing, and if we are, we should make removing our own imperfections our top priority. This advent season let us prepare the way for Christ by speaking the truth, but never forgetting that the truth must be spoken in love.



## POP UP PANTRY & MASK DISTRIBUTION DAY

United Way of Freeborn County (UWFC) is hosting a drive through Pop Up Pantry and mask distribution on Tuesday, December 15th, 2020 at the Freeborn County Fairgrounds in the Show Arena Building. The entrance will be at the north gates off Richway Drive. Distribution will be 9:00-11:00 am or when supplies run out.

To ensure the safety of volunteers and residents, those picking up food and masks will need to follow social distancing protocols at the drive-thru event.

- Vehicles can pull up to the designated drive through location
- Drivers MUST remain in their vehicle
- Drivers will open their trunk remotely and the box will be placed in the trunk. If placing the box in the trunk is not an option, then the box will be placed in the back seat of the vehicle.
- Everyone is asked to wear masks, including those inside the vehicle. If needed, masks will be provided for you.

Masks & food boxes are available to any local family in need. There are no questions asked. Persons unable to pick up food or masks themselves are welcome to send someone to pick up for them, or if significant barriers exist please call 507-373-8670.


