After Pius XII's reform of Holy Week in 1955, and the following reforms of Vatican II, Passion Sunday or Palm Sunday has acquired once again its liturgical character, without losing those wellknown elements with which the faithful had become so familiar for many years. In the liturgy this Sunday, the word of God illumines the gestures and symbols that accompany the first day of this glorious week. The blessing of palms during the Introductory Rite, may be accompanied with a procession that resembles the glorious entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. This ritual, along with the antiphons that are sung and the readings that follow, point directly to the Gospel of Saint Matthew, that proclaims the Passion. The palm branches represent all faithful disciples willing to walk with Jesus toward Calvary, in hope that we will participate in his glorious resurrection. All the symbols and gestures of this Holy Week help us to commemorate the Paschal Mystery of Christ, but they are not to become dramatic representations of events, as in a play or a movie, for these run the danger of remaining at an external and superficial level. All ministers who labor with the word, are

called to interpret these symbols in liturgical ministry, assisting the assembly to better understand these celebrations without distorting the texts or gestures.

Después de la reforma de la Semana Santa de Pío XII en 1955, y las siguientes reformas del Vaticano II, el Domingo de Pasión o Domingo de Ramos ha vuelto a adquirir su carácter litúrgico, sin perder aquellos elementos bien conocidos con los



que los fieles se habían familiarizado durante muchos años. En la liturgia de este domingo, la Palabra de Dios ilumina los gestos y símbolos que acompañan el primer día de esta semana gloriosa. La bendición de las palmas durante el Rito Introductorio, puede ir acompañada de una procesión que se asemeja a la gloriosa entrada de Jesús en Jerusalén. Este ritual, junto con las antifonas que se cantan y las lecturas que siguen, apuntan directamente al Evangelio de San Mateo, que proclama la Pasión. Las ramas de palma representan a todos los discípulos fieles dispuestos a caminar con Jesús hacia el Calvario, con la esperanza de que participemos en su gloriosa resurrección. Todos los ministros que trabajan con la palabra, están llamados a interpretar estos símbolos en el ministerio litúrgico, ayudando a la asamblea a comprender mejor estas celebraciones sin distorsionar los textos o gestos.

FROM THE DESK OF FR. KURT



This weekend is Palm Sunday, otherwise known as "Passion Sunday" and is the only liturgy of the year where we hear two different Gospel stories, stories that relay two completely different reactions to the coming of Jesus into Jerusalem.

The first Gospel has Jesus greeted as a hero, honored with palm branches as if he were a King. The second has Jesus greeted as a criminal, with hatred and people despising Him, calling for His death. These two completely different reactions to the presence of Jesus came from the same group of people. When the people believed that Jesus was powerful and thus would receive something from Him, they sang His praises, but after He was arrested and shown to be weak, they turned on Him and called for His death. Is it possible that at times we also treat Jesus in very much the same way? When things are going our way we are the first to praise God, but when life hands us disappointments, we blame God and dismiss His presence in our life. We are called to be like His mother Mary in the Gospel, who never blamed God for the suffering of her son but suffered with Him, with the hope that God would come to His aid.

We are never alone in our suffering; Jesus walks with us in the challenges and disappointments of life. When Palm Sunday is over we begin Holy Week in which we journey to Calvary along with Christ and await His resurrection at Easter time.

The Christian Initiation Experience for our candidates and Catechumen are just about complete. Their journey will conclude with the celebration of the Tritium, which consists in the three liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. Hopefully we have all journeyed along with them and have fallen in love with Christ as they have fallen in love with Him. Let us all who are able, celebrate the Tritium with our candidates and catechumens, ready and willing to fall more deeply in love with Christ our Savior.
