Using three other parables about the kingdom of heaven, today's Gospel provides accounts of joyful discovery, each character making their discoveries in familiar places: A man finds treasure in his field, a merchant of pearls finds a unique pearl, and fishermen find themselves with nets so full of fish that they need to throw some back. Jesus announces that the kingdom of heaven is in our midst, but he also announces the consequences of those who reject it. Even so, the Father consistently promises and offers his abundant mercy and forgiveness; his recompense is true love and the freedom to love and care for others unconditionally. Such was the case with Solomon in the first reading, who was rewarded with many blessings because he did not ask for wealth or power, but sim-ply for the wisdom of God. The parables of the kingdom, presented in segments as the Gospel texts for previous Sundays, must be seen as a whole for

the overall preparation of homilies, commentaries, prayers of the faithful, and even the liturgical music. Doing so teaches us that in listening to the word proclaimed, the seeds of God's love flourish in our hearts. But only hearts open to receive the message can share in its joy.

Utilizando otras tres parábolas sobre el reino de los cielos, el Evangelio de hoy proporciona relatos de gozosos descubrimientos, cada personaje haciendo sus descubrimientos en lugares familiares: un hombre encuentra un tesoro en su campo, un mercader de perlas encuentra una



perla única y los pescadores se encuentran con las redes tan llenas de peces que necesitan devolver algunos. Jesús anuncia que el reino de los cielos está entre nosotros, pero también anuncia las consecuencias de quienes lo rechazan. Aun así, el Padre promete y ofrece constantemente su abundante misericordia y perdón; su recompensa es el amor verdadero y la libertad de amar y cuidar a los demás incondicionalmente. Tal fue el caso de Salomón en la primera lectura, guien fue recompensado con muchas bendiciones porque no pidió riquezas ni poder, sino simplemente la sabiduría de Dios. Las parábolas del reino, presentadas por segmentos como los textos evangélicos de los domingos anteriores, deben ser vistas como un todo para la preparación general de las homilías, comentarios, oraciones de los fieles e incluso la música litúrgica. Hacerlo nos enseña que en la escucha de la palabra proclamada, las semillas del amor de Dios florecen en nuestros corazones. Pero sólo los corazones abiertos para recibir el mensaje pueden compartir su alegría.




