ASSUMPTION OF MOTHER MARY

-COMPLETION OF GOD'S WORK

he assumption of Mother Mary is a teaching of the Catholic Church, which holds that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory, by the power of God and in the company of the angels. Each time the assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is discussed, it often sounds as though it were a new event in the history of human relationship with God. Enoch was taken away by God: "Thus, all the days of Enoch were three hundred and sixty-five years. Enoch walked with God; and then he disappeared, because God took him away" (Gen 5:23-26). The Prophet Elijah was taken up into heaven by God: "And as they still went on and talked, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them. And Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven" (2 Kgs 2:11). Thus, the idea of the assumption is not an entirely new event in scripture. If God could do this for a patriarch and a prophet, how much more the Mother of whom they prefigured and prophesied about? Her assumption was an honor to her for the role she played in the history of human salvation: "If anyone serves me, he must follow me, and where I am, there shall my servant be also; if anyone serves me, the father will honor him" (Jn12:26).

No one knows exactly when Blessed Virgin Mary was assumed into heaven. However, the belief in the Assumption of Mary into heaven has been there right from the time of the apostles. But why then is the Assumption not in the Scriptures? The reason is simple: the Assumption was not the focus of the gospel writers and the fact that it was not the focus of the gospel writers does not mean that it is irrelevant. At the Council of Chalcedon in 451, when Bishops from all over the Mediterranean world gathered in Constantinople, Emperor Marcian asked the Patriarch of Jerusalem to bring the relics of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Constantinople to be enshrined in the capital. The Patriarch explained to the emperor that there were no relics of Mary in Jerusalem, Mary had died in the presence of the apostles and her tomb is empty to this day: an indication of the Assumption.

During the feast of All Saints, in the year of Our Lord, 1950, when some 36 Cardinals, 600 Archbishops, Bishops, Priests and Religious from different religious communities, Lay men and women; all numbering to about 700,000 thousand people gathered in Rome for the feast of All Saints, Pope Pius XII, well





known as the Pope of Our Lady, in the Apostolic Constitution Munificentissimus Deus proclaimed by the authority of Christ, the glory of the Blessed Virgin Mary; that is, the dogma of the Assumption of Our Lady body and soul into heaven in these words "The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heaven". This teaching about Our Lady attracted great rejoicing from the crowd that gathered in Rome; for in this day, what has long been settled in heaven was made known to the world; By virtue of the Assumption, the Blessed Virgin Mary was glorified.

The assumption of the BlessedVirgin Mary completes God's work in her since it was not fitting that the flesh that had given life to God Himself should ever undergo corruption; after all the idea of death and corruption came with the original sin and if Mary was exempted from original sin why should she see corruption? Mary never was a victim of concupiscence, since it is also the consequence of the fall, and so lived her life without sin (Rom 7:21). The assumption turns our eyes in that direction, where we will follow when our earthly life is over. If she came in glory through the Immaculate Conception, it is fitting that she returns in glory through the assumption. The document of the SecondVatican Council Lumen Gentium says that, "Mary's Assumption into glory is the divine acknowledgement of her perfect conformity with Jesus her Son, the Lord of Lords and the conqueror of sin and death".

We live in the midst of tribulations, with temptations, trials, anxieties, sorrows, etc. Mary is one of the great consolations God offers to His Church. Mary's assumption is a proclamation of the fidelity of God; she manifests the happy destiny of believers who walk this vale of tears, and encourages them to bear with the hardships of this pilgrimage, assuring us with the words of St Paul (2 Cor 4:4; 14-15) that the troubles of this world are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed. The figure of the Blessed Virgin Mary should attract us to make the glorious Christ our target. We often forget the eternal glory that God has prepared for those who dispose themselves to merit it. We deplore so much of our energy in the pride of life, the covetousness of the eyes and in the desires of the flesh. We follow blind passions, seeking after honors, possessions or the transitory pleasures, all of which have an end with this life. Since Mary has been assumed to the highest heavens, St Paul's exhortation to us is worth considering: "look up to the things that are above and not the things that are below". He wants us to look up to Jesus to move from obeying the impulses of our flesh to live the resurrected life. St Paul in his letter to the Philippians (3:12-14) shows us how to do it, "I press on toward the goal, toward the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus".

MESSAGE OF THE HOLY FATHER FRANCIS TO THE PARTICIPANTS IN THE YOUTH FESTIVAL



Dear friends,

I joyfully address you who are participating in the Youth Festival in Medjugorje, an occasion to celebrate and renew your faith. I hope you will live these days as a spiritual pilgrimage that will lead you to encounter the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist, in Adoration, in Confession, in biblical catechesis, in silent prayer and the Rosary, and also through testimonies.

The theme proposed for your reflection this year is: "Here are my mother and my brethren!" (Mt 12:49). The evangelist Matthew recounts that while Jesus is speaking to the crowd, someone tells him that his mother and brothers are standing outside looking for him. Jesus responds with a question: "Who is my mother, and who are my brethren?" (Mt 12:48). And pointing to his disciples, he says: "Here are my mother and my brethren! For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother, and sister, and mother" (Mt 12:49-50).

We are very struck by Jesus' gesture and words because, at first sight, they appear to be a lack of respect towards his Mother and his relatives. In reality, with this expression He wanted to show us that it is adherence to the Father's will that establishes us in union with Him, a bond superior to the closest ties of blood. Dear young people, God's will is a priceless treasure! That is why the Virgin Mary forged a bond of kinship with Jesus even before she gave birth to him. She becomes disciple and mother of her Son the moment she accepts the words of the Angel, responding: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord, let it be to me according to your word" (Lk 1:38). From that moment, her whole life was a continuous fulfilment of God's will.

And yet, we often find ourselves in contrast with this will; at times we struggle to understand it and accept it, we would like a different life, without challenges, without sufferings; we would like ourselves to be different, perhaps more intelligent, richer in talents or natural aptitudes. However, for us there is no will better than that of the Father, which is the plan of love for us in view of His kingdom and our complete



happiness. Often, we fear this will, because we are afraid that God may impose on us something purely arbitrary and not for our good; we are afraid that accepting his will means renouncing our freedom. Instead, we must seek intensely, asking God the Father to let us know His will and ask that it be fulfilled in us. And the deepest reason for wishing this is shown to us precisely by Jesus: doing the will of the Father makes us His children, brothers, sisters, mothers, and it makes us grow in love towards Him and towards others.

Dear young people, God has a plan of love for each one of you. Do not be afraid of His will, but place all your trust in His grace. For Him, you are precious and important, because you are the work of His hands (cf. Apostolic Exhortation Christus vivit, 115). Only He knows hour heart and your deepest desires. Only He, who loves you with an absolute love, is capable of filling your aspirations. No-one, besides God, can give you true happiness. Following Mary's example, know how to give Him your unconditional "yes". Let there be no place in your life for selfishness or for idleness. Make the most of your youth to lay, together with the Lord, the foundations of your existence, because your personal, professional and social future will depend on the choices you make during these years.

On this journey, dear young people, may Mary Most Holy accompany you and teach you to discern and welcome the will of the heavenly Father in your lives. With youth, imprint the present time with hope and enthusiasm. Be enthusiastic missionaries of the new evangelization! Bring to those who suffer, to those who are searching, the joy that Jesus wants to give. Bring it into your families, into your schools and universities, into your workplaces and groups of friends, wherever you live. If you allow God's grace to work in you, if you are generous and persevering in your daily commitment, you will make this world a better place for all. I bless you from my heart. And I ask you, please, to pray for me.

SILVER JUBILEE CELEBRATION

DON GUANELLA BOYS' HOME



CUDDALORE: The Don Guanella Boys' Home Community rejoiced as they celebrated the Silver Jubilee of the Foundation Day of the House. The community members thanked Almighty God for protecting the boys for the past 27 years. Indeed, it is an appropriate time to show great reverence to our Founder, St. Luigi Guanella, the Apostle of Charity, who won over the world with great love and faith. He brought dignity and respect to the lives of the aged, orphans, and persons with disabilities.

The Boys' Home was the first mission that our Congregation instituted in India. It was opened on the 29th of July 1996 in the old building, which was adjancent to the Sagayamatha Parish Church. We would have held our Jubilee Celebration in 2021; however, due to the pandemic and a vacancy in the Curia of the Archdiocese of Pondicherry- Cuddalore, we were forced to postpone it. It was decided, instead, to celebrate the Silver Jubilee on the Foundation Day of the new building.

We felt honored to lay the foundation stone for the new building on the feast of St. Thomas, the Apostle of India. St. Thomas came to India in the first century and spread the faith. He won the hearts of the faithful for Christ and became a model and martyr for the faith. This occasion was a wonderful day in the history of the Indian Church.

The educational services provided by the members of the Guanellian mission are a way of evangelizing and contributing to the church's mission. In keeping with this spirit of the mission, the Don Guanella Boys' Home has as its main objective the noble task of helping orphan and semi-orphan students to attain excellence in their education. Our mission has a specific system of life and education. We are thankful to our Confreres, who worked for the Indian Guanellian mission. Rev. Fr. Domonico Saginario who was the Provincial Superior of the Roman Province; Rev. Fr. Tito Credaro, the first Italian priest who visited India on the 3rd of July 1986; Rev. Fr. Piero Lippoli, a pioneer who visited India more than 32 times and loved the boys' home mission; Rev. Fr. John Bosco who was the first Indian Priest and First Delegate Superior; Rev. Fr. Dhanasekar who was the First Director; and Rev. Fr. Soosai Rathinam who was the first Regent and first Indian Provincial Superior for the Divine Providence Province. We also extend my sincere gratitude to the Most. Rev. Dr. Michael Augustine, the Archbishop of Pondy-Cuddalore, who contributed to our mission.

The community is thankful to Most Rev. Fr. Umberto, the Superior General and his councilors,



Rev. Fr. Ronald, the Provincial Superior, and his councilors who are animating the confreres in the light of the Gospel and the ways of St. Luigi Guanella. On the 3rd of July 2023, the Most Rev. Dr. Francis Kalist, Archbishop of Pondy-Cuddalore, celebrated a Holy Mass of Thanksgiving at 6 pm. Rev. Fr. Provincial Superior read the gospel and gave the homily. In memory of the Silver Jubilee,



we gifted widows and the poor with twenty tailoring machines. Also, we donated five wheelchairs to physically challenged individuals. Rev. Fr. Francis, Superior, gave the vote of thanks. Our Guanellian Priests, Diocesan Priests, Religious Sisters, and nearly 1000 people participated in this event.

On this joyous occasion, we acknowledge and are grateful to all the previous Superiors, Directors, and Administrators who worked for the enchantment of boys home. I remember all the previous students who spread the Spirit of Guanella in society. May our Father, St. Luigi Guanella, continue to intercede for this house so that we can celebrate the Golden and Diamond Jubilees.

GUANELLIAN FORMATION PROGRAM IN ITALY

Eight confreres from Divine Providence Province, two confreres from Stella Maris Delegation and one confrere from Vice Province of our lady of Hope partook in 'Sui Passi di Don Guanella' that was organized from 20th June to 3rd July, 2023 under the title "Followers of St. Guanella: Servants of Charity together". The purpose of organizing this formation program was to listen closely to the voice of the Church and to look attentively at the example of St. Guanella to continue his mission among the poor in our context by getting into the roots and experiencing the real spirit and charism of our Founder.

This experience of permanent formation program started in our Generalate with the introduction by Bro. Franco. We spent the days in Rome from June 20 to 22 by visiting some of the important shrines and Basilicas in Rome; listening to the conference about Italy and Church in the time of Don Guanella by Bro. Franco and the orientation talk by Fr. Bruno Capporoni about St. Joseph's shrine and the pious union of St. Joseph.





After the initial session in Rome, we moved to Campodolcino. We stayed in Campodolcino from 23rd June to 28th June. During these days, we meditated on 'the call of Don Guanella by climbing the mountain from Campodolcino to Fraciscio and from Fraciscio to Gualdera; 'labor and Providence' at Savogno by climbing the mountain; 'trials and education' at Traona and Nuova Olonio; 'discovering the Father' at Olmo; 'priestly ministry' at Prosto. The meditative path during our stay in Campodolcino was organized by Fr. Marco Maesani. On 29th June, we walked by the lake and arrived at Gravedona and visited the parish house at Pianello and did the meditative path at Camlago.

After the meditating on the first part of the life of Don Guanella, we went to our mother house at Como. We stayed in our mother house from 30^{th} June to 3^{rd} July. On 30^{th} June, we went to Turin to visit the Little House of Providence (St. Joseph Cottolengo) and the museum of Don Bosco.

Then, on 1st July, we spent the day by visiting our saints: Bacciarini and Vaccari at Lugano and Barza respectively. On 2nd July, we visited our Guanellian Museum at Como, mother house of our sisters at Lora and the ordination chapel of Don Luigi Guanella. On the final day, we had the evaluation and concluded our pilgrimage and the formation program with the Eucharistic celebration at the altar of Don Luigi Guanella

The entire program was animated by Br. Franco and Fr. Samson. Our sincere gratitude to the General Superior and the Council and the Provincial Superior and the Council for organizing such a memorable pilgrimage to experience the Guanellian Charism, Spirituality and Mission.

Inauguration of Don Guanella Evening School

DPP, Chennai: Don Guanella Evening School at DPP, Chennai was reopened for the academic year 2023-24 on 15th June, 2023 and the inaugural function was organized on 27th July, 2023. RELAXATION OF THE INMATES IN THALAKADU



Thalavadi: The Nazareth Illam Community has introduced a new relaxation program for the inmates. The program is named "Kaanbom Karpom." Inmates are taken to a place outside the community and encouraged to mingle and get involved with others. Thus, the Nazareth Illam inmates were taken to "Thalakadu" for their relaxation on the 11th of July. They were accompanied by Fr. Lourduraj, Fr. Arun David, and some community staff. Altogether, 56 inmates participated in this program and were happy to experience different places and engage with new people. Although it appears to be a contradiction, sometimes the most productive thing you can do is to relax. This new relaxation program helps the inmates involve themselves with the people and will help them forget the stress and overthinking that causes them upset.

A WALK DURING FULL MOON AND NEW MOON DAYS

Thalavadi: For centuries, physicians and philosophers attributed behavioral changes on the moon's pull. The word "lunatic" stemmed from the idea that changes in mental states were related to lunar cycles. The connection between these two is even supported in historic legal treatises. For instance, famous British jurist, William Blackstone, wrote that people gained and lost their ability to reason according to the moon's shifting phases. The Nazareth Illam community organized a walk to a nearby temple and church during the full and new moon days. Thus, on July 3rd (the day of the Full Moon), the inmates





walked to Bannary Amman Koil, and on July 17th (the day of the New Moon), they walked to Soosaipuram Parish Church. This exercise helped the inmates increase energy levels while improving memory, mood, and sleep. An added benefit was that they received spiritual assistance since they walked to temples and churches. The walks helped to make them tired and improved their sleep quality.

CANDLE-MAKING

Chennai: To develop the vocational skills of our students a new candle making machine was bought and On July 12, 2023, Rev. Fr. J. Ronald, Provincial Superior and Rev. Fr. Benson Superior blessed the machine and motivated the students to learn the vocational skills which will serve as a tool and aid in developing vocational skills for students.



VISIT OF THE DISTRICT DIFFERENTLY ABLED WELFARE OFFICER

Chennai: Mr. Srinivasan, B.Sc., MA., B.Ed., District Differently Abled Welfare Officer visited Don Guanella Special School and Residential Home on July 18, 2023. The students showed their respect towards the people of the trust by singing a song for them. This not only made them happy but it also made them feel special. The residents of Preethi Nivas danced and sang for the students. It made them happy to know that they had rehearsed it earlier just to give a perfect performance before them. Some of the residents shared their stories with the students which made them emotional.

NIGHTINGALES MEDICAL TRUST

Bangalore: The GPN community was privileged to have 'Nightingales Medical Trust (NMT)' a well-established and reputed non-profit organization working for the well being of the elderly since 1998 in Bangalore chose our home to work for the betterment of elders organizing a workshop by implementing programmes through innovative and community-based support systems. He also requested the parents to educate other children in the family to care for them in the future without hesitation. There is no scientific connection between the emotional change of the child to no moon and full moon day; it's normal that a special child getting emotional disparity once in fifteen days.
