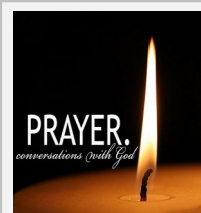

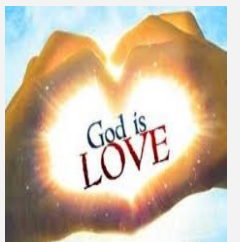



Patterns of Prayer

Consider the world we live in. Again and again, little boys are asked the question, "**What do you want to be when you grow up?**" That's part of the origin of the male ego, the drive for achievement, for power, for dominance, for self-satisfaction and fulfillment. So it is today. So, in the Gospel, was it for James and John. These disciples of Jesus wanted power and dominion. But Jesus said to them that the places at His right and His left hand were already reserved for other people. Jesus went on to teach James and John, disciples of the Master, that we are different from the pagans, the gentiles. They make their authority evident; their leaders make their importance known. It must not be that way with us, says Jesus. And He says that to us today, here and now.

The role of Church authority, then, is to serve the rest. If someone does not serve the community, He can never aspire to greatness. Why did Cardinal Law of the Archdiocese of Boston have to resign? Because he did serve the rest. Why was John Neuman of Philadelphia, the bishop, recognized as a saint? Because he did serve the rest, and he served well.

justify many, the hoi polloi, the masses of people, not just the elite or the few. The servant does this precisely by his suffering. Someone who is weak in faith cannot do this. Someone who is selfish cannot do this. Someone who is immature cannot do this. But the suffering servant of God is indeed mature, is generous, and is abounding in faith. So, today's Gospel reminds us that Jesus Christ is that suffering servant above all. He is the model of service to others, the exemplar of patience in pain, the leader in personal victory.

If you look at a tray of cups, held up before, you see different kinds of drinking vessels. You make a choice, and you pick a particular cup, with whatever beverage it contains. That is a symbol of your future. So, Scripture says "**I will take the cup of salvation.**" So, in the garden, Jesus prayed, "**Father, let this cup pass from me.**" And to us, Jesus says, "**Are you ready to drink the cup I offer you?**" He is asking if we are ready to share His destiny, His willingness to suffer, His role of service to others.

That is what it means for us to answer "**Amen**" to the words "**Blood of Christ**" and to take the chalice and to drink. We remember the Gospel today, with the invitation of Christ to share His destiny. We say "**Amen.**" And then we take the cup, because we want to share that destiny.

Christians take the chalice because they accept the challenge. Christians take the chalice because they accept the community, the Church, which sometimes is the cause of our suffering. Christians take the chalice because to do so is the highest degree of sharing, of communion, of common celebration. This is part of the fullness of meaning, of drinking from the chalice at the time of Communion.

Do this, and you shall live. The kingdom of heaven is yours.
