Lk 3:15-16, 21-22 - The people were filled with expectation, and all were



asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."

After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."



### The Baptism of the Lord

My sisters and brothers in Christ, With this feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we complete the Christmas celebrations in the Church. For us Christians, it is not enough simply to give gifts or to think about the birth of Jesus. Instead, we have celebrated His birth, His naming, His circumcision, His being shown to the Gentiles, the arrival of the Magi, and now we skip all the way to His baptism.



Really this feast of the Baptism of the Lord is part of the Solemnity of the Epiphany. The Baptism and the Birth of the Lord were originally part of the mystery of the Epiphany. Sometimes it helps us to know that these celebrations did not all begin on the day that Jesus was born, nor did they all begin as soon as He ascended into heaven, nor even when the Holy Spirit came down on the believers in the early Church. Instead, the feasts and celebrations in our Catholic Church evolved to express the full mystery of Christ. There are many recent feasts and celebrations but also these very ancient ones.

The Baptism of the Lord is not only about Jesus' baptism, it is also about our baptism and the need for baptism in general and about Jesus being truly human even though He is truly God. In the first centuries of Church, there was an enormous focus on the impossible becoming possible. How is it that God can become fully a human being? Many of the early hymns speak over and over about this contrast: God who is all powerful becomes a tiny baby and cannot survive without the human help of others.

Today, perhaps, we have lived so long in the western world with the presence of Christ in our Churches and almost taken for granted that we almost forget how incredible this gift of salvation is for us.



The first reading, from the Prophet Isaiah, describes a savior. Today we recognize that we can see Jesus in this figure from Isaiah. We are so blessed with a Savior who leaves us our human freedom, who does not condemn us even when we reject Him and who is constantly there seeking us. There is a sense of justice in the reading that might leave us quite uneasy. So often we begin to think in our present world that there is no judgment of God, that God either does not exist or does not care about what we do. The scriptures tell us over and over that God does care and that there will be a judgment. Some of this way of thinking is surely just to make us more aware of

what we are doing. But the reality is still there: God loves us enough to care about whether our actions are good or bad. We are given time in this world so that we can learn how to choose the good. Baptism is about being willing to die in order to choose the good.

The second reading and the Gospel are about the Baptism of Jesus. It is clear that it was a major event in the life of Jesus. Once again the early hymns of our Christian faith point out the contract: Jesus, innocent and without sin, undergoes Baptism to bring about our salvation. Jesus does not need to repent nor to be baptized, but chooses baptism in order to draw us to salvation.

For many of us, our baptism was simply something that happened when we were young. We do not feel the strength of this enormous experience in our lives. We look on baptism simply as an experience of joining the Church.

Today as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we can make a commitment to understand our own baptism better, we can commit ourselves to learning more about our faith. Most of all, we can commit ourselves to living the divine life that was given to us in baptism and which is still alive with us. Let us give glory to God and rejoice in His presence within us.




