“A New Commandment I Give to You: Love One Another as I Have Loved You” (John 13:34)

Love—true, selfless, Christ-like love—is the cornerstone of the Christian life. When Jesus gathered with His disciples on the night before His crucifixion, He did not leave them with a list of instructions, doctrines, or rituals. Instead, He gave them something far more transformative: a command to love. “A new commandment I give to you,” He said, “that you love one another as I have loved you.”

This was not a new idea in the sense that love had never been taught before. The Old Testament calls us to love our neighbors. But what Jesus presented was deeper, higher, and holier. He wasn't simply asking us to love as humans love—conditionally, partially, and often self-interestedly. He was asking us to love as He loves: with a love that stoops low to wash dirty feet, that forgives even when wronged, that lays down its life for both friend and enemy.

To love one another as Christ loves is to enter into the mystery of divine love. It means loving the unlovable, forgiving the unforgivable, and serving the undeserving. It is not a love that waits to be earned, but a love that flows freely and abundantly because we ourselves have been loved first. We cannot give what we have not received. Therefore, to love others truly, we must begin by abiding in the love of Christ—soaking in it, resting in it, and allowing it to heal our wounds and soften our hearts.

This love does not come naturally to us. It is a supernatural gift that grows in the soil of grace and humility. It requires daily surrender—choosing to see Christ in others, choosing patience over irritation, mercy over judgment, and presence over busyness. It may mean bearing one another's burdens in silence, speaking truth with gentleness, or standing beside someone in their darkest hour.

The commandment to love one another is not just for our personal holiness, but for the sake of the world. “By this all people will know that you are My disciples,” Jesus said, “if you have love for one another.” The authenticity of our faith is not measured by how much we know, but by how well we love. Our churches, families, and communities become reflections of God's kingdom not when they are perfect, but when they are places of radical, humble, sacrificial love.

Imagine a world where this kind of love is lived out daily—a world where kindness is more powerful than hatred, where generosity outshines greed, where understanding replaces suspicion. That is the world Christ invites us to build—not through grand gestures alone, but through countless small acts of love that reveal His presence in the ordinary.

May we, then, take this commandment not as a burden, but as a gift—a calling to become living echoes of God's love in a world that longs to be known, healed, and embraced. Let us love, not in word or speech only, but in truth and action. And as we love one another, may we draw ever closer to the heart of Christ, who loved us to the end—and beyond.

“Un mandamiento nuevo les doy: Que se amen los unos a los otros como yo los he amado” (Juan 13:34)

El amor —verdadero, desinteresado, como el de Cristo— es la piedra angular de la vida cristiana. Cuando Jesús se reunió con sus discípulos la noche antes de su crucifixión, no les dejó una lista de instrucciones, doctrinas ni rituales. En cambio, les dio algo mucho más transformador: el mandato de amar. “Un mandamiento nuevo les doy —dijo—: Que se amen los unos a los otros como yo los he amado”.

Esta no era una idea nueva, en el sentido de que el amor nunca se había enseñado antes. El Antiguo Testamento nos llama a amar al prójimo. Pero lo que Jesús presentó era más profundo, más elevado y más santo. No nos pedía simplemente amar como los humanos amamos: condicional, parcial y, a menudo, egoístamente. Nos pedía que amáramos como Él ama: con un amor que se inclina a lavar los pies sucios, que perdona incluso cuando se nos ofende, que da la vida tanto por amigos como por enemigos.

Amarnos unos a otros como Cristo ama es adentrarnos en el misterio del amor divino. Significa amar a los que no merecen amor, perdonar a los imperdonables y servir a los que no lo merecen. No es un amor que se gana con esfuerzo, sino un amor que fluye libre y abundantemente porque nosotros mismos hemos sido amados primero. No podemos dar lo que no hemos recibido. Por lo tanto, para amar verdaderamente a los demás, debemos comenzar por permanecer en el amor de Cristo: empapándonos de él, descansando en él y permitiendo que sane nuestras heridas y ablande nuestros corazones.

Este amor no nos surge de forma natural. Es un don sobrenatural que crece en la tierra de la gracia y la humildad. Requiere entrega diaria: elegir ver a Cristo en los demás, elegir la paciencia sobre la irritación, la misericordia sobre el juicio y la presencia sobre el ajetreo. Puede significar llevar las cargas de los demás en silencio, decir la verdad con dulzura o acompañar a alguien en su momento más difícil.

El mandamiento de amarnos unos a otros no es solo para nuestra santidad personal, sino por el bien del mundo. «En esto conocerán todos que son mis discípulos», dijo Jesús, «si se aman los unos a los otros». La autenticidad de nuestra fe no se mide por cuánto sabemos, sino por cuánto amamos. Nuestras iglesias, familias y comunidades se convierten en reflejos del reino de Dios no cuando son perfectas, sino cuando son lugares de amor radical, humilde y sacrificado.

Imagina un mundo donde este tipo de amor se viva a diario: un mundo donde la bondad sea más poderosa que el odio, donde la generosidad supere a la avaricia, donde la comprensión reemplace a la sospecha. Ese es el mundo que Cristo nos invita a construir, no solo con grandes gestos, sino a través de innumerables pequeños actos de amor que revelan su presencia en lo cotidiano.

Que, entonces, tomemos este mandamiento no como una carga, sino como un don: un llamado a ser ecos vivos del amor de Dios en un mundo que anhela ser conocido, sanado y abrazado. Amemos, no solo de palabra, sino con verdad y acción. Y al amarnos unos a otros, acerquémonos cada vez más al corazón de Cristo, quien nos amó hasta el extremo y más allá.


