Dear Friends,

As we reach this half way point of Advent called Gaudete Sunday – which translated means rejoice – we can reflect on where we are and how we are doing during this season of preparation. How have we been doing in preparing for Christmas? It can be difficult because there is a great deal going on in our lives: decorating, activities (whether seasonal or not), cleaning, work, school, and more. In short, time seems to be the big thing lacking in our lives.

Despite this difficulty, we can always slow down and recognize that God is never far. This past week, a group of us finished the last of six classes on prayer. In this time, I described how to pray a Holy Hour (sometimes it becomes a holy half hour, or holy fifteen minutes, or even less depending on time constraints). A piece of advice that may be pertinent to our busy lives, St. Ignatius speaks of every holy hour or any time of prayer beginning with an act of presence, or to "become aware of the Father's gaze of Love for you"

"A moment or so before I enter the place where I am to contemplate or meditate, I will stand for the length of an OUR FATHER, and with my consciousness raised on high, I will consider how the LORD my GOD beholds me. Then I will make an act of reverence or humility." (St. Ignatius – Spiritual Exercises #75)

Even if we are busy in our daily lives, we can always slow down long enough to recognize that God himself is looking upon us with Love. No matter what we've done, no matter how good or bad things have become, the Love of God never ceases nor changes. Our response to this Love however, is another story.

God so respects our free will that He will allow us to turn away from His Love. When this turning away or sin consists of grave matter, full knowledge, and full freedom, we cut God out. His love doesn't change, but we have. This is why when we take a moment to become aware of how the Lord beholds us, it will always be with a love beyond all telling. Coming to this awareness more regularly in our daily lives will help us in our response to God, helping us to continue turning to him in and through the sacraments. As we approach Christmas, let us become more and more aware of the presence of God, who loves us so much, that He sent His only Son into the world.


