From the Pastor...

Dear Friends,

"Why do you call me, 'Lord, Lord,' but not do what I command?" Luke 6:46

I had heard this many times in the past, but I really *heard* this passage of Scripture a few years ago. Now when I say *heard*, I mean that there comes those times where we truly hear a passage and can say at that point we've *heard* it because it hits us in a particular way that's really personal.

There is not one among us that God is not calling to Himself. Jesus, as the second person of the Holy Trinity, God made man, calls us to the fullness of relationship with the Holy Trinity – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. For many though, such a reality seem miles upon miles away – a ship that will never see the shoreline. I understand this because when I was younger sitting in the pews every Sunday, such a relationship with God seemed so far away. While an intense experience of God would propel me into the Seminary, for the next three years afterward, I found myself going back and forth between great extremes in my life in Christ. To say things were as a roller coaster would be an understatement. The question crossed my mind constantly: "Lord, where are we going? When does this level out?"

It came in this passage, at least implicitly. Trying to have God bend to our own will and pleasure is never going to work out, and I'd imagine we can all relate. We try to make God follow us – bartering with him by trying to make deals that if He does what we want, we'll do his will as payback. Here is where above passage rings greatly true in our lives. We call Jesus **Lord**, which means someone or something having power, authority, or influence; a master or ruler.* We are used to this potentially being a bad thing, as we've been hurt or burned by people in authority in the past. Yet when we are talking about the person of Jesus, who literally loved us so much that he laid down his life in atonement for our sins, is it ever a bad thing to allow ourselves to be under *that* kind of authority?

What is the greatest obstacle keeping you from a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ? Whatever it is, that is what we need to work on. We call him **Lord**, but are we doing what he commands us? Do our lives truly reflect placing ourselves in relationship with him by living the Commandments, the Beatitudes, and lives of prayer according to our state in life? Because when we do that – we will see more stability come forth in our lives; the rollercoaster will level off, and we will begin to live in the peace that only Our Lord Himself can provide.
