

A Message from the Pastor...

Dear Friends,

We are made for the Infinite! It sounds a little dramatic or over-the-top, but yet this is true. All the Saints in Heaven, that we celebrated on November 1st, are experiencing the infinite Love of God that we're destined for at this very moment! The Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (Compendium from here on) describes Heaven like this:

*"By 'heaven' is meant the state of supreme and definitive happiness. Those who die in the grace of God and have no need of further purification are gathered around Jesus and Mary, the angels and the saints. They thus form the Church of Heaven, where they see God "face to face" (1 Corinthians 13:12). They live in a communion of love with the Most Blessed Trinity and they intercede for us."**
[Bold my emphasis]

This part about no further need of purification is something we need to consider because this is God's great mercy to us: if we are not yet perfected, we are given the rest of what is necessary to enter this great gift through **Purgatory**.

Purgatory, as the Compendium states, is "...the state of those who die in God's friendship, assured of their eternal salvation, but who still have need of purification to enter into the happiness of heaven."**
 We are "able to help the souls in Purgatory by offering prayers in suffrage for them, especially the Eucharistic sacrifice. They also help them by almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance."**

Put another way, in the Holy Scriptures, we see the New Heavenly Jerusalem coming down from Heaven in the book of Revelation. The image is a wedding feast between Christ and the Church. If we've ever been to a wedding, we don't just go in sweatpants and a t-shirt. We are fully adorned and put on our best. Christ Himself uses a parable of a Wedding Feast that all are invited to, as an image of a banquet. Each guest has a Wedding Garment, but there is one that does not. The king casts out a person without this garment in the parable because they are not adequately prepared to enter this wedding feast.

For those who have passed from this life but are not in a place to enter the wedding feast, Christ does not cast them out to Hell, but in His great Mercy, gives us the ability to finish what was started here in our lives. We are made perfect to put on the wedding garment and enter into the perfection of Union with God Forever. But recognize either way that we are to be made perfect here and now, or perfected in Purgatory. This is so long as we do not pass away with Mortal Sin on our souls, which opens us to the possibility of separating ourselves from God eternally.

Why not begin now? Why not allow ourselves to turn everything over to Jesus and enter into the relationship with Him in the here and now? The Saints speak of Prayer, the Sacraments, and our Self-Offerings/Self-Denials as the means of communion with God. We lift up those who've passed away in prayer so they can enter into the joys of Heaven while we pursue that gift by allowing God to lead us each day in our own lives. Saints like St. Ignatius of Loyola and his 14 Rules for Discernment of Spirits are an excellent way to start this journey.

Pray for one another; pray for those who've gone before us. Pray that we can all enter into the perfection of Heaven when the time comes, where we will want for nothing.



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Since 1969, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has addressed poverty by attacking its root causes and funding community projects that promote independence as a means of finding a permanent end to poverty. Did you know that 38.1 million Americans live below the poverty line and more than 1.5 million children experience homelessness in a year? Many of these Americans are considered "working poor"—they work but do not make enough money to cover essentials like housing, health care, child care, and food. That's why the CCHD theme is "Help Those on the Margins."

This collection is the primary source of funding for CCHD's anti-poverty grants and education programs. This year, *seventy-five percent of the collection will stay here in our diocese.*


Today I am meeting with our parish and community groups which received 19 local grants from the 2020 campaign, it is always inspiring to see how these small seeds grow into fruitful programs to support the dignity of people who find themselves most often on the margins. During this pandemic, the need has increased dramatically in the many food pantries and emergency assistance programs which receive support from our local CCHD funds.
