FIRST SUNDAY IN ADVENT NOVEMBER 28, 2021

A Message from the Pastor...

Dear Friends,

We now begin a new the liturgical year, which makes sense in regards to the Liturgical Season we begin today. "The word *Advent* is from the Latin *adventus*, which means "coming." It encompasses the span of time from the fourth Sunday before Christmas until the feast of the Nativity of Our Lord on December 25. Like Lent, Advent is a preparatory season of looking forward to and waiting for Jesus to be made present in one's life in a new and meaningful way. As Christians, we're not only looking forward to the annual celebration of Christ's birth, but also for the time when Christ will come again."*

How do we look forward to Jesu being made present in a "new and meaningful way"? The first thing we should always to is approach the mystery of the Incarnation (Christ as the second person of the Holy Trinity entering time and space) in humility. Remember, we are dealing with one of the Mysteries of our Faith, not in that we can't know anything about it, but that we cannot exhaust it's meaning.

Often times, we can take a "well, I've heard this before" approach with our Faith. But when it comes to God being made man, we should look again at the story of the Nativity of Jesus. One thing we can come to know is just what happens when we speak of Our Lady being the Mother of God.

Realize this: When it comes to Mary, we are talking about someone who didn't have that pull towards sin that was a consequence of Original Sin. Imagine for a moment a car with wheel's out of alignment. If you have ever dealt with this, without our hands on the wheel to correct, the car will careen off the road. This can be an analogy of us regarding the pull towards Original Sin. When the car is in alignment, however, it still goes on the current pathway. Mary is analogous to this in that our pull towards making all of our good about the tangible, as opposed to the highest good that our heavenly things, she doesn't deal with. It's because of this that she is able to learn how to open to God's will so perfectly, that Divine Life is conceived within her.


Later in the scriptures, it's Mary who will be at the center of the Apostles, teaching them to open to the Holy Spirit so that they may bear a different kind of spiritual fruit. They will open to God and receive the gift of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost – a gift that will change them powerfully. From this moment, they will go out and share the Gospel to the detriment of their own lives, all being martyred except for St. John, who was exiled. To do this, you need something more then pure will, especially since we know that aside from John, the Apostles had all abandoned Jesus in His Hour because of fear.

Ask Mary for help with the realigning our hearts this Advent, that we may not just fall into the trap of the ordinary things of life, but we may seek the Heavenly Goods we are all called to

receive. Let us pray for one another as we begin this new season of Advent. God Bless,
