

From our Pastor...

Dear Friends,

It's always good to see the Saints of the Church, who were even closer



to the time of the Apostles, explaining the same teachings of our faith that we learn about today. St. Cyprian, who lived in the 3rd Century AD (aka the 200's), speaks to us today about making sure we are in a good place to receive the Gift of Our Lord in Holy Communion.

"In a Treatise on the Lord's Prayer, the 3rdcentury bishop St. Cyprian briefly explains who should receive Holy Communion.

He explains, "Now, we who live in Christ and receive his eucharist, the food of salvation, ask for this bread to be given us every day. Otherwise we may be forced to abstain from this communion because of some serious sin."

St. Cyprian teaches a fundamental truth about the reception of Holy Communion. For him, it is a sacrament to be given to those "who live in Christ" and who have not committed a "serious sin."

He adds that, "Clearly they possess life who approach his body and share in the Eucharistic communion."

What's interesting is the way St. Cyprian adds, "For this reason we should be apprehensive and pray that no one has to abstain from this communion, lest he be separated from the body of Christ and be far from salvation."

As Christians, we should desire that everyone can participate in Holy Communion and actively pray that any obstacles to Communion be removed.

However, the truth remains that serious sin can prevent us from Holy Communion and the way to remove that sin is through the sacrament of confession.

May we look at ourselves and any sin that may prevents us from receiving the Eucharist and pray that everyone else will similarly be able to share at the Table of the Lord."*

Reading I: 1 Kgs 19:16b, 19-21

The LORD said to Elijah: "You shall anoint Elisha, son of Shaphat of Abelmeholah, as prophet to succeed you." Elijah set out and came upon Elisha, son of Shaphat, as he was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen; he was following the twelfth. Elijah went over to him and threw his cloak over him. Elisha left the oxen, ran after Elijah, and said, "Please, let me kiss my father and mother goodbye, and I will follow you." Elijah answered, "Go back! Have I done anything to you?" Brothers and sisters: For freedom Christ set us free; so stand firm and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery.

For you were called for freedom, brothers and sisters. But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh; rather, serve one another through love. For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, *You shall love your neighbor as yourself*. But if you go on biting and devouring one another, beware that you are not consumed by one another.

I say, then: live by the Spirit and you will certainly not gratify the desire of the flesh. For the flesh has desires against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; these are opposed to each other, so that you may not do what you want. But if you are guided by the Spirit, you are not under the law.
