

From our Pastor...

Dear Friends,

In these times, we've all seen the world continually become stranger. A rampant individualism has swept through the western world, in particular in our part of the country. This continued obsession with me, myself, and I has become devastating to community elements and trust in one another. What if we decided to go another way? What if we decided, as I read in a recent article, to allow God "to give a knowledge of seeing ourselves as he sees us?"*

This can only happen if we decide to allow God to show us the riches of Prayer. You've heard me speak of this, but I fear we often "fill in the blank" when we hear the word Prayer before we actually consider anything further. To be blunt, we in the Western world are greatly impoverished regarding Prayer. Mother Teresa called us one of the poorest nations on Earth for this reason. Echoing the story Deacon Pierre relayed about Bishop Harrington calling prosperity the greatest factor in the decline of faith, it seems it was of the same mindset as a Saint who said the same thing. *What need have we of God if everything is great?* This has become known through the continued decline in Mass attendance and faith in the True Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. I often notice these things, even here in our own Parish.

What, then, do we do? We are coming to a crossroads because parts of our region here in New England are failing. In talking to a friend, Maine (their one Diocese covers the entire State) is down to 30 priests, with many Missionary Priests from Africa and India assisting. Vermont is in a similar situation. Massachusetts is better, but only slightly, and will run into these situations in the coming years. Yet we must remember that God has not stopped calling *each of us to serve the Church!*

Some are called to be Priests or Religious Sisters. Some are called to the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony (if you were not married in the Church, you need your marriage convalidated). All are called to a relationship with God! Yet the only way to "tune in" is through turning toward God and coming to see ourselves as God sees us. Fr. Donald Haggerty, quoted in the article I was reading, states, "*Without someone in our lives who knows us deeply, before whom nothing is hidden or disguised, we are liable to ignore the real poverty that resides in our soul. And we may miss, too, the beauty that God has planted in a concealed manner within us.*"* "*Unless we come to see ourselves as God sees us, Father Haggerty warns, we '... will never come to know being loved by God in a deeper portion of the soul, where the nakedness and need of the [soul] and its unseen beauty are gazed upon.'*"*


Authentic Prayer comes through putting ourselves in place to be found. Starting October 11th, we'll be looking at this prayer journey and going deeper into this knowledge of how God sees us and where He is calling us to be. I hope to see you there.




