

A Message from the Pastor

Dear Friends,

Saints come in all shapes and sizes. St. Therese of Lisieux was only 24 when she passed, yet she said only a few months before her passing: "I feel that my mission is about to begin, my mission to make God loved as I love Him, to teach souls my little way."*

Her *Story of a Soul* has been shared around the world since her passing, so profound that in 1997, St. John Paul II declared her a Doctor of the Church. She was canonized years before in 1925, only a few years after her passing and was declared Blessed 2 years prior in 1923. Here is more on the miracles related to her beatification:

Shortly after her death in 1897, the remarkable story of a French Carmelite nun. Thérèse of Lisieux, began to spread like wildfire. Her autobiography, Story of a Soul, was an instant hit, and it wasn't long before people began to seek her intercession.

Her canonization process was already opened in 1914 and reports of miracles began to flood in to the Vatican offices.

In particular, **two miracles were verified** that paved the way to her beatification in 1923, in the year she would have turned 50 years old.

According to the <u>Society of the Little Flower</u>, "in 1923 the Church approved of two spontaneous cures unexplained by medical treatment.

Sister Louise of St. Germain was cured of the stomach ulcers she had between 1913 and 1916.

The second cure involved **Charles Anne**, a 23-year-old seminarian who was dying from advanced pulmonary tuberculosis. The night he thought he was dying, **Charles prayed to Thérèse**. **Afterward, the examining doctor testified,** 'The destroyed and ravaged lungs had been replaced by new lungs, carrying out their normal functions and about to revive the entire organism. A slight emaciation persists, which will disappear within a few days under a regularly assimilated diet.'"

Pius XI subsequently beatified Thérèse of Lisieux on April 29, 1923.


It only took two years to verify two more miracles that led to her canonization on May 17, 1925.**





Ascension of the Lord

Question:

Couldn't Jesus have done more good if he stayed on earth, rather than ascended into heaven?

Answer:

This is an interesting question! During his earthly life, Jesus gave sight to the blind, healed paralytics, drove out demons, and fed thousands with only a few loaves of bread. Imagine what he could have done if he'd never ascended into heaven! Imagine what our world could be! It's an interesting thought to consider, especially as the world faces challenges that only seem to deepen and expand. Yet at the Last Supper, Jesus says, "It is better for you if I go." Why? His response must have seemed strange to the Apostles at the time. In his place, Jesus says, he will send the Paraclete, the Comforter, the Advocate. He promises to send the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' departure allows the Apostles to become the leaders he has formed them to be. Jesus is no longer situated in only one geographical location, and his Church will never be a political kingdom. Soon after the Ascension, we celebrate Pentecost — the descent of the Holy Spirit and the radical empowerment of the followers of Jesus. We share in that empowerment and in that mission. Jesus is present in the sacraments, and he is present in us. Through our faith, hope, and love, we are called to be the good he does here on earth!
