


NOVENA TO DIVINE MERCY

ST. FAUSTINA - FEAST DAY OCTOBER 5

Saint Faustina was born in 1905 into a poor Polish family and experienced a religious calling from a young age. She initially deferred pursuing a religious vocation to help her family with her earnings as a housekeeper. At age 19, after a vision of the suffering Jesus, she earnestly sought entrance into religious

life. Initially turned away by many convents, she entered the order of the sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in 1925. In April 1928, she took her first vows with her parents in attendance. St. Faustina served the Congregation as a cook, gardener, and porter. While living a simple religious life, she grew in great union with God, experiencing profound sufferings as well as consolations. She had many visions of Jesus and wrote a diary of her experiences. St. Faustina died from tuberculosis at the age of 33 in 1938.

In 1959, the Vatican suppressed the Divine Mercy devotion. But in 1978, the Sacred Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith lifted the suppression after new original documents were examined and texts were retranslated. Cardinal Karol Wojtyla strongly promoted the message of Divine Mercy. Laster, as Pope John Paul II, he canonized St. Faustina, in April 2000, and designated the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. Because of her work fostering devotion to Divine Mercy, St. Faustina is known as the "apostle of Divine Mercy." Jesus appeared to her many times and spoke of his great and unfathomable mercy to those who would trust in him. Jesus told St. Faustina that he wanted the Sunday after Easter to be celebrated as a "feast of Mercy," as a refuge for all souls, especially poor sinners. One Divine Mercy Sunday, celebrated the weekend after Easter, the Gospel tells the story of when Jesus appeared in a locked room where the disciples were hiding.

SAINT JOSEPH SCHOOL TO HOST THE WORCESTER CATHOLIC WOMEN'S CONFERENCE



Saint Joseph School is proud to host the Worcester Catholic Women's Conference on Worcester Gatholic Saturday, October 7th, 2023. There will be wonderful talks by great national speakers and Women's Conference opportunities to meet them and make new friends. There will be time for fellowship, to go to confession, celebrate the Eucharist, and altogether strengthen your Catholic identi-

ty! This year's theme is, "Male & Female, He Created Them." Speakers include:

- Fr. Derek Mobilio from Barre & Worcester, MA. Fr. Mobillio's local parish assignments were Blessed Sacrament, Worcester; Our Lady of Providence, Worcester; Good Shepherd, Linwood and St. Augustine, Millville; and St. Mary, Shrewsbury. He also participated in the 2019 Tertio Millenio Seminar in Poland which was created "to deepen the dialogue on Catholic social doctrine (and the teachings of St. Pope John Paul II) between North American students and students from new democracies of central and eastern Europe."
- Dr. Deborah Savage who recently joined the Theology faculty at Franciscan University, having taught both philosophy and theology at the St. Paul Seminary School of Divinity at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota for thirteen years. She received her doctorate in Religious Studies from Marquette University in 2005; her degree is in both theology and philosophy. Dr. Savage is the co-founder and acting director of the Siena Symposium for Women, Family, and Culture, an interdisciplinary think tank, organized to respond to John Paul II's call for a new and explicitly Christian feminism.
- Patricia Sandoval who is an international prolife and chastity speaker who has traveled around the world since 2007 sharing her story of her three abortions, work behind the hidden doors of Planned Parenthood and followed by nearly three years as a homeless drug addict. Her story is a testament to the saving love and mercy of Jesus Christ and His desire to bring this world's hidden dangers into the light for healing.
- Father Colin J. Blatchford, who, in September 2020, was appointed to the position of Associate Director of Courage International, which includes more than 180 Courage chapters and 80 EnCourage chapters in dioceses throughout the United States and in 15 other countries on five continents. Founded in New York in 1980, Courage provides pastoral care and spiritual support for Catholic men and women who experience same-sex attractions or gender identity discordance and who desire to live chastely in accord with the teaching of the Catholic Church on homosexuality and gender.
- Dr. Christopher Klofft who is Associate Professor of Theology at Assumption University in Worcester, MA and Adjunct Professor of Moral Theology at Pope Saint John XXIII National Seminary in Weston, MA. He received his S.T.B., S. T.L., and S.T.D. from the Catholic University of America. His areas of specialization include sexual ethics, marriage and family, gender, Catholicism and modernity, and the intersection of Christianity and popular culture.

Dzisiejsza Ewangelia prezentuje nam przypowieść o dwóch synach. Jej treść niejako przenosi nas z powrotem do pierwszego czytania. U Ezechiela pierwszy bohater był sprawiedliwy i zszedł na złą drogę, drugi był bezbożny, ale się nawrócił. U Mateusza pierwszy posłuszny syn dopuszcza się nieposłuszeństwa, drugi, nieposłuszny, wypełnia polecenie ojca. Bóg nie ocenia pochopnie, każdy ma możliwość, by się zmienić. Jeśli ktoś schodzi na złą drogę, to znaczy, że jego wiara nie była ugruntowana i zachwiała się wobec jakichś przeciwności. Czasem też wystarczy jakieś wydarzenie,

impuls, by człowiek powrócił na dobrą drogę, jak stało się z jednym z ukrzyżowanych z Jezusem złoczyńców.

Pan Jezus po tej przypowieści wygłasza jednak słowa, które były nie do przyjęcia dla zwierzchników żydowskich: "Zaprawdę, powiadam wam: Celnicy i nierządnice wchodzą przed wami do królestwa niebieskiego". Chodziło Mu o tych, którzy zeszli ze złej drogi, by w swym życiu postępować już tylko sprawiedliwie, w przeciwieństwie do arcykapłanów, czy uczonych w Piśmie, których nawet prorocy w swych wysiłkach nie potrafili sprowadzić na dobrą drogę. Pan Jezus uczy nas dziś, że nigdy nie jest za późno, aby stać się dobrym człowiekiem, aby zasłużyć sobie na życie wieczne i wstęp do królestwa niebieskiego.
