

## FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT December 24, 2023

"Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" - LUKE 1:28



At our local high school, a number of teachers reminded their students that class ended when the bell rang, not a few minutes beforehand. Students anticipated the end of class and began packing up their things, just when the teacher was making the most important point. Patience, even in the classroom, is a virtue.

The readings remind us that God fulfilled His promise to David when Gabriel announced to Mary that she had been chosen to be the mother of Jesus. Her response to the heavenly messenger was so simple, yet reflects a great faith and hope: "Let it be done to me as you say." # SAINT JOHN THE APOSTLE & EVANGELIST DECEMBER 27



Saint John the Apostle, the son of Zebedee and Salome, was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus. John was called to be an Apostle by our Lord in the first year of His public ministry. He is considered the same person as John the Evangelist, John of Patmos and the Beloved Disciple.

John's older brother was St. James the Great, another one of Jesus' Twelve Apostles. Jesus referred to the brothers as "Boanerges," meaning "sons of thunder." John is believed to be the longest living apostle and the only not to die a martyr's death.

John is known as the author of the Gospel of John and four other books in the New Testament - the three Epistles of John and the Book of Revelation. The authorship of the Gospel is credited to the "disciple whom Jesus loved," and John 21:24 claims the Gospel of John is based on the "Beloved Disciple's" testimony.

Saint Joseph School LEGO Robotics Team Wins Award - Advances to State Championship

On Sunday, December 10th, the Saint Joseph School FIRST LEGO League (FLL) Robotics Team competed in the Worcester FLL Qualifier Event at Worcester Polytechnic Institute (WPI). This year's challenge theme was Masterpiece. Therefore, in addition to competing with an autonomous robot that the team designed and programmed to solve missions, the team had to imagine and innovate a new way to create and communicate art across the globe—using their imagination to re-think the world of art! Following much discussion regarding their interests and hobbies, the SJS team, also known as the Fantastic 4, decided to focus on dance. In addition, the team learned that there are limited resources for visually impaired dancers to study independently. Therefore, they utilized a tactile drawing board to create a library of basic poses and positions that dancers could feel instead of seeing. Then, they shared their project with fellow Saint Joseph School students, dancers, and visually impaired friends. During the Qualifier Event, the team had to present their research and results in a fun and creative manner. Congratulations to the team for being named a semi-finalist in the Innovation Project Award category. LEGO presents this award to teams that utilize diverse resources for their Innovation Project to help them comprehensively understand their problem, have a creative, well-researched solution, and effectively communicate their findings to judges and the community. In addition to receiving the award, the team received a "golden ticket," inviting them to compete in the Massachusetts Championship FIRST LEGO League Tournament at WPI on Saturday, December 16th. Team members include 6th grade students Lukas Barbosa, Mychael Jones, Jacob Lopez, and 8th Grade student Emily Macko. Saint Joseph School Principal Beth Boudreau and parent volunteer Mariusz Macko coach them. Congratulations, and best of luck in the State Championship!

# CZWARTA NIEDZIELA ADWENTU

24 grudnia, 2023

"Anioł wszedł do Niej i rzekł: «Bądź pozdrowiona<sup>11</sup>, pełna łaski, Pan z Tobą, ».." (£k 1, 28)



Kto kieruje historią świata? Ludzie? Niezaprzeczalnie mają swój udział. Spis powszechny, opisany przez Ewangelistę Łukasza, został zarządzony przez cesarza Oktawiana Augusta. Miał do tego pełnię władzy. Jednakże autor Ewangelii sugeruje duchowe znaczenie tego wydarzenia. Cesarz rzymski inicjuje wydarzenie po to, aby BOŻY PLAN się wypełnił, aby Król Świata narodził się w Betlejem, zgodnie z zapowiedzią prorocką, aby pasterze na betlejemskich polach usłyszeli Dobrą Nowinę z ust aniołów. Św. Ambroży, biskup Mediolanu z IV wieku, daje piękny komentarz do tego wydarzenia. Oto teraz Chrystus dokonuje spisu, ale chce nie jednego narodu, ale wszystkich ludzi, nalega nie na pieniądze, ale na wiarę, wysyła nie cenzorów z rózgami, ale apostołów z Ewangelią. Ten spis obejmuje również dzieci, czego dowodem jest św. Jan Chrzciciel, cieszący się już w łonie matki z przybycia Mesjasza. Św. Ambroży wyjaśnia, że każdy wiek jest hojny dla Chrystusa. Patrząc zewnętrznie na nasze dzieje, społeczne i indywidualne, wszystko zależy od ludzi. Bada-

jąc wydarzenia wzrokiem wiary, widzimy, że w historii dokonuje się nieubłagalnie plan zbawienia wyznaczony przez Wszechmogącego Boga, choć często zakrytymi i tajemniczymi sposobami.

W Boże Narodzenie 1978 roku papież św. Jan Paweł II powiedział że świąteczne przesłanie skierowane jest do każdego człowieka na świecie, do jego człowieczeństwa. To bowiem ludzkość zostaje 🙇 wywyższona w ziemskich narodzinach Boga Syna. Cały rodzaj ludzki zostaje włączony w jedność Boskiej Osoby Syna z Jego Ojcem i Duchem Świe-

W te Święta Bożego Narodzenia, gdy patrzymy na Dzieciątko Jezus w żłóbku, pamiętajmy, że Bóg nie zostaw nas samych z naszymi ludzkimi doświadczeniami – z naszymi słabościami, zmaganiami, wyzwaniami, cierpieniami i chwilami smutku i samotności. Jezusa Chrystus, przez narodzenie z Maryi, zanurzył naszą ludzką naturę do swojej 🖁 boskości. Nie ma niczego w naszym życiu, czym nie moglibyśmy podzielić się z Bogiem, niczego zbyt nieistotnego lub zbyt przytłaczającego, czego 🜋 nie moglibyśmy Jemu przedstawić w modlitwie. A jeśli to zrobimy, nie tylko doznamy pocieszenia, ale także zaczniemy żyć Jego własnym boskim życiem tutaj na ziemi.
