

SAINT ANDRE BESSETTE FEAST DAY JAUARY 6



Born in Canada, Andre worked for three years in the United States as a weaver and manual laborer. After returning to Canada in 1870, he joined the Congregation of Holy Cross and took final vows in 1874. For decades, Brother Andre humbly served his community near Montreal as doorman, janitor, barber, gardener

and infirmarian. With St. Joseph as his model and intercessor, he developed a healing ministry and huge following. In 1904, he moved into Montreal to help build the Oratory of the Holy Cross, and remained there for the rest of his life. When this "Miracle Man of Montreal" was canonized in 2010. Pope Benedict XVI said he "lived the beatitude" of the pure of heart."

On Saturday, December 16th, the Saint Joseph School FIRST LEGO League (FLL) Robotics Team competed in the Massachusetts FLL Championship Tournament at WPI. Over 450 teams competed in FIRST LEGO League robotics competitions in Massachusetts this season and 72 of the top teams competed at WPI. The Saint Joseph School team was one of two teams representing Southern Worcester County. The town of Douglas was also represented.

This year's challenge theme was *Masterpiece*. Therefore, in addition to competing with an autonomous robot that the team designed and programmed to solve missions, the team had to imagine and innovate a new way to create and communicate art across the globe—using their imagination to re-think the world of art! Following much discussion regarding their interests and hobbies, the SJS team, also known as the Fantastic 4, decided to focus on dance. The team learned that there are limited resources for visually impaired dancers to study independently. Therefore, they utilized a tactile drawing board to create a library of basic poses and positions that dancers could feel instead of seeing. Then, they shared their project with fellow Saint Joseph School students, dancers, and visually impaired friends.

Following their Qualifier Event on December 10th, the team spent more time improving their project which included 3D printing their library to improve durability. This also made the library easier to sanitize between each use. In addition, they spent time creating a poem to help express how the FIRST Core Values of discovery, innovation, impact, inclusion, teamwork, and fun influenced their time together. Finally, they also visited Aspire Dance Studio in Oxford, MA to continue to share their innovation project.

At both the qualifier and championship events, the team had to present their research and results in a fun and creative manner. Congratulations to the team for receiving a Judge's Award at the State Championship. The FLL Judges Award is a special recognition given to teams that stand out for reasons other than the core award categories. The award is based on the judges' observations and impressions of the team. During the presentation of this award, it was noted that the team made significant progress in their confidence and capability in both the Robot Game and Innovation Project and are shining examples of excellent Core Values. They demonstrated that they understand that what they discover is more important than what



they win. The judges also noted that the team "danced their way into their hearts."

Team members include 6th grade students Lukas Barbosa, Mychael Jones, Jacob Lopez, and 8th Grade student Emily Macko. Saint Joseph School Principal Beth Boudreau and parent volunteer Mariusz Macko coach the team. Congratulations on your hard work and achievements!



ŚWIĘTO ŚWIĘTEJ RODZINY 31 grudnia, 2023

"Wybaczajcie sobie nawzajem, jeśliby miał ktoś zarzut przeciw drugiemu:.

Jak Pan wybaczył wam, tak i wy!" (Kol 3, 13)



Ofiarowanie Pańskie jest obrazem naszej relacji z Bogiem. Nie chodzi o sam kult religijny i przestrzeganie przepisów prawa. Chrystus ofiarował całego siebie Bogu, na ofiarę miłą i doskonałą, Bogu przyjemną. W tym ofiarowaniu uczestniczy cała Święta Rodzina. To ona daje Bogu pierwszy wyraz służby i oddania we wspólnocie rodzinnej. W świątyni świadkami ofiarowania się są Symeon i prorokini Anna oraz inni wierzący. To za nich i wszystkich ofiarowanych Bogu oddaje się Chrystus w ofierze krzyżowej. Ofiarowanie stanowi decyzję oddania się Bogu i zrozumienie, że tylko Bóg jest pełnią i sensem życia. Nasz chrzest jest

również decyzją woli i ofiarowaniem się Bogu, kiedy składamy samych siebie. Od tej pory wszystko możemy ofiarować i dedykować na chwałę Boga, nawet rzeczy najmniejsze i prozaiczne. Święty Paweł przypomina: Radosnego dawcę miłuje Bóg. Kto skąpo sieje, to i skąpo żąć będzie.

W pierwszą niedzielę po Bożym Narodzeniu Kościół katolicki obchodzi niedzielę Świętej Rodziny. Święto to zaczęto obchodzić w różnych krajach począwszy od XVIII wieku a zatwierdził je papież Leon XIII. Święto św. Rodziny po raz pierwszy ustanowił 4 listopada 1684 r. w Kanadzie, za aprobatą papieża Aleksandra VII, biskup Francois Montmorency- Laval. Na stałe do liturgii wprowadzono je za pontyfikatu papieża Leona XIII, który na prośbę kard. Bausa, arcybiskupa Florencji, 20 listopada 1890 r. wydał dekret aprobujący "kult czci zwrócony ku Rodzinie Świętej". Leon XIII był też pierwszym, który wskazał na małzeństwo jako miejsce uświęcenia. W Liście Episkopatu Polski do wiernych z dnia 23 października 1968 roku czytamy: "Dziś ma miejsce święto przedziwne; nie święto Pańskie ani Matki Najświętszej, ani jednego ze świętych, ale święto Rodziny. O niej teraz usłyszymy w tekstach Mszy świętej, o niej dziś mówi cała liturgia Kościoła. Jest to święto Najświętszej Rodziny - ale jednocześnie święto każdej rodziny. Bo słowo «rodzina» jest imieniem wspólnym Najświętszej Rodziny z Nazaretu i każdej rodziny. Każda też rodzina

podobnie jak Rodzina Nazaretańska jest pomysłem Ojca niebieskiego i do każdej zaprosił się na stałe Syn Boży. Każda rodzina pochodzi od Boga i do Boga prowadzi". – zaczerpnięte z tygodnika "Niedziela"
