

A Note From Father Michael

Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend's gospel presents us with an interesting teaching of Christ on good stewardship. As we reflect upon The Parable of The Workers in The Vineyard, let us remember that time is one of our most precious resources which God invites us to use for the building up of the Kingdom of God. In the parable, a landowner needs work done in his vineyard and he goes out seeking workers at multiple points during the day. Notably, he notices that two groups are standing idle despite the fact that they have the opportunity to work for him. Rather than ignoring this idleness, the landowner inquires of these

The group the landowner encounters at 5 PM blames others for the fact that they are not working. This group refuses to take responsibility for the fact that they are not working because they have not taken opportunities that have been offered them. Astutely, the landowner refuses to accept the group's excuse and orders them to get to work!

groups why they are not already working.

In the parable, all the workers, those hired first and those hired last, all get the "usual daily wage," which, in Jesus' time, was one denarius. This small amount of money allowed day laborers to buy enough food to feed themselves and their families for one day. This was the "expected" amount they should have expected to receive. Yet, the workers hired first complained that they should have received more from the landowner because they worked longer. In response, the landowner explains that his payment of workers is both generous and just.

What is the important message of this weekend's gospel? Time is one of our most precious resources. It is a gift from God that, like our talents and finances, God expects us to use wisely and generously. How do we use our time? What are our priorities? How much time do we give to God in our daily and weekly schedule?

The Parable of The Workers in The Vineyard reminds us that we must be good stewards of time. We must use some of it to worship God and to contribute to the building up of God's Kingdom. This means actively participating in the life of the Church and parish, generously using our time to positively contribute to the well being of our community.

Like some of the day laborers in the parable, we can make excuses about why we cannot give some time to God. We can blame others for our poor stewardship of time. Yet God, who is symbolically represented by the landowner in the parable, refuses to accept our excuses and expects us to "get to work," putting our charity into action and working at evangelization. Our good stewardship of our time, talents and treasure figures into our eventual judgment. If we are faithful to the Lord, we will all receive the "usual daily wage" of eternal life's fullness.
