A Note From Father Michael

Dear Friends in Christ,

This Sunday's Gospel gives us a joyful message. In it, Jesus makes it clear "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life." On this Fourth Sunday of Lent, the Scriptures invite us to reflect upon the depths of God's care for us and for all that He has made.

Considering this gospel, Lent is a time when we can come to know the love of God more. As we meditate upon the sacrifice of Christ for our sins, we consider that it was freely chosen. Jesus embraced His Father's will, as painful and tortuous as it was, in order to save us. The cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ is relevant at all times and to all people. Lent reminds us never to take it for granted. In the gospel, Jesus teaches Nicodemus that God sent Jesus into the world so that "the world might be saved through Him." Jesus adds "whoever believes in Him will not be condemned." Through this teaching, Jesus makes it clear that faith in Him leads to eternal life.

During this holy season, God offers us special graces and when we receive them, our hearts are transformed. Faith in Christ is a gift from God which is the most important one we should ever receive. Perhaps, we or someone we love has refused faith or deeper faith in the past. Maybe we or they were afraid of what it would mean for us to have deeper faith. During Lent, we reflect upon our openness to stronger and deeper faith in Christ and pray for those who have not been open to receive faith. We ask the Lord, through the power of His blood shed for our sins, to bring about true conversion in the hearts of all people.

As we think more faithfully and prayerfully about God's love for us, we ask God that He touch our hearts and bring us to a deeper sense of gratitude for Christ and the gift of His life for us.
