A Note From Father Michael

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we enter the Fifth Week of Lent, we are aware of the closeness of Holy Week in which we celebrate the central mysteries of our Catholic Faith. Soon, we, together with the whole Church, will enter deeply into the liturgies of this sacred time. All of these offer us special graces. Let us pray that we are open to receiving them and sharing the Holy Week Masses and services with our parish family.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus speaks about his "hour." He knows that the time for Good Friday is near and admits that He is "troubled" contemplating the torture He will soon endure. Interestingly, it seems that Jesus' sacrifice was meant to happen at a specific time in human history. Some theologians have referred to this as "the center of time." This means that all events before and after the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross are less important than the event itself. Jesus sacrificial death for us changed the whole universe. It broke the power of the devil over the world and gained for us God's forgiveness. In faith, we contemplate the Cross of Jesus as the greatest manifestation of God's love.

Even though Jesus knew the Father's will and wanted to carry it out perfectly, it was not easy. We remember the events of Gethsemane where Jesus, in mental anguish, prayerfully asked God to allow His cup of suffering to pass Him by. Yet, at that time, He also made it clear to God that it should be God's will, not His, that should be done. Jesus' willingness to submit His will to the Father's will is a model for all Christian disciples.

May the gospel inspire us as we learn from Our Lord and seek to carry out what He teaches us.
