

### A Note From Father Michael

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we continue on in the Easter Season, we reflect upon Jesus as The Good Shepherd. This Sunday's gospel presents Our Lord in this way and invites us to grow in our understanding of His friendship with us.

Jesus tells us, in the Scriptures, that He is "the Good Shepherd." But, what exactly does this mean?

At Jesus' time, some in the religious leadership had become confused concerning what it meant to please God. While they focused on keeping the Law, Jesus observed that they failed to love God and their neighbor. They also were blind to their sin and refused to hear Jesus' call to repentance and conversion. This is why, in John's Gospel, Jesus identifies them as "blind." These leaders were, in fact, "bad" shepherds of the flock of God's people.

Jesus identified Himself in contrast to them. He explained that He would give His life for them rather than acting selfishly. He also explained that He knew His sheep personally and that He wanted them to know Him personally. Jesus would prove that He was the Good Shepherd through His sacrifice on Calvary.

Jesus has given everything for us. He chose to embrace His Father's will for Him so that He could save us. He had the freedom and power to stop the Crucifixion from happening but lovingly accepted torture and death for our sake. This is why He is The Good Shepherd.

We learn from Jesus' example that it is often in dying to ourselves that others come to know the love of God. Our sacrifices, shown towards others in charity, introduce them to a God who is present to them in love and mercy. The authenticity of our care for others shows others that God is real and helps them to want to get to know God. It is more convincing than theological jargon or textbook knowledge.

May our meditation upon Jesus as the Good Shepherd inspire and guide us now and always.


