

A Note From Father Michael

Dear Friends in Christ,

In this Sunday's Gospel, we learn that when Jesus sent out the Apostles on mission he did so pairing them "two by two." Some Scripture commentators suggest that this was the practice of the early Church as it sought to bring the Good News of Christ to the world.

But, why is this detail so important? As we reflect upon it, there are several reasons.

The first is that Jesus sought to create community among His followers which would involve them helping each other and depending upon each other's gifts and strengths. As Baptism makes Christians members of God's family, so engaging in shared missionary activity strengthens the bonds between believers in the Church.

The second reason is that Jesus was protecting His followers from dangers. Some Scripture commentators believe Jesus' decision to send out the disciples "two by two" reflects His practice of an Old Testament biblical injunction concerning testimony being established by two witnesses. In sending out the disciples "two by two" Jesus was showing care and concern for their well-being without them recognizing it.

The third reason is that Jesus may have been encouraging the disciples to embrace humility. By pairing them, Jesus was ensuring that not one of them could boast solely of his accomplishments. As He taught them to depend upon God's Providence, He also showed them that cooperation and collaboration was God's way that the Church would be built up. Conversely, separation between believers and divisions among them would work against the Church's unity and growth.

As we reflect upon the meaning of this Sunday's gospel, let us seek opportunities to assist our fellow parishioners in our shared journey of life, recognizing that we travel together on life's road as the family of the Church.
