A Note From Father Michael

Dear Friends in Christ,

Yearly, Summer's end brings with it thoughts of vacations ending and students of all ages returning to school. Such change is part of the annual cycle of time we have come to know well. As change happens, God gives us new opportunities and graces which, if we follow them, lead us to greater depth in our friendship with Him.

What changes are you facing at this time in your life? In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus and His disciples face an important moment. After Jesus has taught earnestly about the Eucharist, His disciples must make a decision to have faith or to walk away from it, doubting that Jesus is speaking the truth.

The decision that Jesus' disciples make has far-reaching implications for them and for the Church. It is the most important choice that they will ever make. Sadly, the gospel tells us, that many of Jesus' followers "returned to their former way of life" because they could not accept His teachings. What happened to all these people?

In our present society, many view church as something that they do not need. Family commitments, employment, social life, athletics and other activities seem more important than participation in the life of the Church. Yet, what are the long-term, practical implications of living without faith? Is life better with God or without God?

Sometimes we do things without considering the consequences of them. Faith in Christ leads to eternal life but it also gives our lives today something that our brothers and sisters in the world do not have. This is hope in the Lord who is always at work, doing out of love that which is most beneficial. The virtue of hope helps us to deal with life in a different way than those who do not have it.

May the changes in our lives afford us new opportunities to consider the importance of faith and how we live it.



Propagation of The Faith Mission Co-Operative Visiting Priest. On the weekend of September 7th & 8th at all Masses.

St. Peter's will warmly welcome Fr. Augustine Owusu, of the Diocese of Gaborone as this year's Propagation of The Faith Mission Co-Operative visiting priest.

Fr. Owusu will be speaking to us about the missionary activities of his Religious community. Their efforts of evangelization involve many humanitarian activities, namely, care for Remote Area Dwellers, commonly known as "Bushmen". They also care for orphans and vulnerable children (OVC), and a number of pre-schools for children and the disadvantaged. They run two clinics for the disadvantaged and continue to provide social services to people. They operate five primary schools in addition to one senior secondary school.

There will be a second collection the weekend of September 7th & 8th to help support the people of Botswana, Africa.
