A Note From Father Michael

Dear Friends in Christ,

This Sunday's Gospel presents us with a picture of the disciples' lives which is worth reflecting on. In this gospel, Jesus travels to Galilee with His friends and the journey is marred by disagreement. Jesus notices that the disciples are arguing with each other but it is not until later that He learns what the argument is about. When He asks them about their arguing, the disciples respond that they have "been discussing among themselves...who was the greatest."

Though the disciples have faith in the Lord and have put it into action by following Him, Jesus shows them that this faith needs growth. Because they misunderstand what the Kingdom of God is about, the disciples wonder if they will be given positions of prominence in an earthly kingdom Jesus will soon set up.

Later on in their lives, the apostles became saints. Their faith became stronger and their love of God became purer. They learned and applied to their lives the important spiritual lessons Jesus had taught them. These led to their martyrdom for the faith for all except St. John. Were the apostles ready to give their lives for Jesus soon after they'd begun following Him?

Probably not.

The disciples and apostles' example shows us ourselves.
Though we have faith and are following Jesus, all of us need ongoing conversion. We need more grace from God, a deeper prayer life, more understanding of our Catholic Faith and more commitment to putting it into action through works of charity. Throughout our life-span,

Christ calls us to grow with Him.

In the gospel, Jesus uses the example of a child to show the disciples how they must grow. The child's meekness, openness to others, trust and simplicity are qualities which would necessarily counteract the selfish ambition which was making the disciples quarrel. St. Therese, The Little Flower, used the same example of the child in her quest for spiritual perfection. In her Little Way, St. Therese encourages all Christians to follow Jesus in

As we seek to apply this Sunday's gospel to our lives, let us ask St. Therese to intercede for us so we may receive, in abundance, God's graces.

Why do Catholics use candles as part of prayer?

Last weekend at all Masses, I included in my homily some information for the parish on why Catholics use candles as part of their prayer tradition. To review, the tradition of using candles in prayer is very old, dating back to the first centuries of the Church. In the 3rd and 4th Centuries, early Christians used candles in funeral processions, at the tombs of martyrs and deceased loved ones and to honor the saints and their relics at prayer. Candles were used at Mass from the 7th Century onward, several centuries after the legalization of Christianity in the Roman Empire. Christians' use of candles was inspired by lights being burned in the presence of important Roman officials and personages to designate their significance in society. Christians thought that this practice should be fittingly continued in the Eucharistic presence of Jesus in the church tabernacle as He is the most important person of all. Besides candles being used on altars at Mass, two other kinds of candles are used by Catholics, these being votive and vigil candles. Votive candles, like those available on the candle racks in church, are used by Christians seeking the help of Christ, Our Lady or the saints for their needs. These may include praying for the repose of the soul of deceased persons, for the healing of the sick or for various special intentions. Vigil candles are used by Christians praying in an attentive or waiting way, especially in situations where perseverance is required.

We will be having the baked goods table this year and will need donations of your favorite treats!


