

A Note From Father Míchael

Dear Friends in Christ, This Sunday's Gospel, concerning Jesus' encounter with an adulterous woman and her accusers, reveals God's personal care for all human beings, even in their sinfulness. As we see this personal care shown to the woman, we reflect upon God's love for us in our individual circumstances and ask how our consideration of this truth can help us to grow in God's friendship. Although the scribes and Pharisees dragged the adulterous woman to Jesus in shame, Jesus recognized that she had an inherent dignity and worth because she was a child of God. He acknowledged her sin but also defended her from the unjust proceedings her accusers were attempting to implicate her in. Though the Law said that both partners in an adulterous relationship should be stoned to death, the Pharisees and scribes only presented the female one to Jesus for judgment, thus making the entire situation fundamentally unjust.

Jesus' response to the woman's accusers was to "write on the ground with His finger." Scripture suggests that this action meant that the woman's accusers, due to their lack of faith and charity, had forsaken God as they attempted to prosecute the adulterous woman. They also did not have good intentions in bringing the woman to Jesus for judgment, as the gospel tells us that it was to "test" the Lord.

After Jesus challenged the woman's accusers and they left, Jesus interacted with the woman respectfully and with mercy. This mercy was tempered with truth and justice, however, as Jesus instructed the woman to "do not sin any more." Indeed, Jesus had saved the woman's bodily life as well as that of her eternal soul. On this Fifth Sunday of Lent, the Gospel invites us to consider the personal care Jesus has for each of us in true love, justice and mercy.


