

A Note From Father Michael

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today, we celebrate the "Birthday of The Church," the great feast of Pentecost. It is the Church's birthday because, on this day, the Apostles were given the strength of the Holy Spirit to move beyond their fears and begin to boldly proclaim the Good News of Jesus to the world. Though Jesus had already founded the Church on the rock of St. Peter's faith, Pentecost marked the moment when the evangelizing activity of the Apostles, strengthened by the power of the Holy Spirit, successfully reached many people and caused the Church great growth.

We received the Holy Spirit first at Baptism and then, again, at Confirmation. One of the main reasons we are Confirmed is to be strengthened by the Holy Spirit to bear witness to Christ in the world. In other words, we cannot do it successfully merely on our own power. We need God's grace and gifts to remain faithful to the Lord in a society which, increasingly, is secularized and hostile to Christian faith.

A close study of the events leading up to Pentecost, as found in Scripture, shows us that the Apostles were controlled by fear and timidity prior to their reception of the Holy Spirit. It was only after they received the Spirit that they overcame their fears and were able to carry out the mission Jesus had entrusted them with.

What are our fears and how do they control us? How can faith help us to overcome them? How often do we pray to the Holy Spirit for guidance, wisdom and strength? On this Pentecost, we recognize that the Holy Spirit is the way in which we will grow in our friendship with Christ and is the means by which the renewal of our parish community will be accomplished. Let us pray to the Holy Spirit today and each day that He will complete the good work of God, which He has already begun in us, and inspire us as we seek His grace and wisdom as a parish community.

From the time I was about 6 years old and heard the organ in church for the first time, I knew I wanted to play one someday. It was so cool to hear all the different sounds one instrument could make.

I grew up in a musical household, and I gravitated to music quickly. I started playing at the age of 13 in my home parish of St. Mark in Sutton. After several years of gaining more experience, I began playing in other parishes in the Worcester diocese, and with God's hand, He led me here to St. Peter's- twice. It's become my second home. I was thrilled to lead the parishioners of both St. Mark and St. Peter's with the organ and piano as they've sung some of my favorite hymns. It's a great joy when I hear the voices raised to God in a well-loved hymn such as Amazing Grace or How Great Thou Art. I get more excited which leads me to really be full of the spirit and more creative musically with the instrument.

Attending any Mass without music is dead to me. There's no life to it. Even a capella singing without the accompaniment of some kind of instrument is better than nothing. So, I strive my best to provide the best possible music to augment your spiritual journey as you experience the Mass each week. Using the gift of music that God gave me is my way of giving back to Him, and to use that gift to enrich your experience. This year marks my 50th year as a church musician. I pray God continues to bless me with my hands, feet, heart and soul to put all I have into every note and chord I play for as long as I can.
