"Unclean! Unclean!"

That's what lepers in the ancient Middle East called out when anyone came near them. They were required to alert others to their disease so they wouldn't physically or ritually contaminate another person.

Can you imagine having to declare *out loud* what is wrong with you every time someone approached? It would be difficult enough to have to shout, "Common cold!" "Bladder infection!" But what if we also had to declare our moral failings to everyone we met? "Compulsive liar!" "Self-centered!" "Refuses to forgive!" "Judgmental!" Talk about an isolating experience.

This is what makes Jesus' actions in the Gospel so remarkable. The original Greek translation of the phrase "moved with pity" indicates that Jesus was riveted in his soul by this man's condition and his plea. Jesus touched the man, despite all rules to the contrary, and healing occurred. He reached through all the barriers, the boundaries, the uncleanness, and loved this man for the person he was—beyond all that was wrong with him.

Jesus does this for us too—he sees beyond our sin, beyond our selfishness, beyond our patterns of bad behavior. He loves us for who we are at our very core, made in God's own image. So the challenge for us is to do the same. Saint Paul impels us to be imitators of Christ. Though our first instinct may be to see the sinfulness of others, the irritations of family members, and the faults of coworkers, we must look beyond the failings and see with the eyes of Christ. We must touch with Christ's hands and love with Christ's heart—nothing less is expected of us.

It is a snowy morning and I wonder why God put me in this place to live. Did you ever question the realm of our existence and out of all the places in the world and all the people that we could be a part of as family that we were chosen to be where we are? It is a bit heretical to question the will of God but on a snowy morning when it is known that I no longer enjoy this wintery mess I am sure that the good Lord forgives me.

We begin the holy season of Lent on Wednesday and we mark our preparation time for Easter. In the bulletin this weekend you will find a tri-fold flier outlining the different ways we can make Lent a special time. Take time during these weeks of Lent by coming to Mass or attending Stations of the Cross and praying for a renewal of your faith. This Wednesday there are multiple times to receive the blessed ashes to indicate our willingness to be a people aligned in the promise of Jesus' forgiveness.

Our two Town Hall Meetings are coming up. Thursday, February 22, is the first evening and will comprise itself of information regarding our moving forward as a Family of Parishes. The dynamic and future of being a Family of Parishes will be shared. Also a part of the evening's agenda will be the understanding of the new weekend Mass schedule and weekday Mass schedule. There will be no voting on the times of Masses. Any decisions will be made by consensus rather than voting. The second evening will be Thursday, March 8, and this will be the evening that a Mass schedule will be determined. Some parishioners are worried that they will not be present for the second evening and wanted to have someone represent them and give a proxy vote. I assured them that this was not necessary because it will not be a count of hands or votes that will be taken. This decision will be difficult because it causes us to think outside of our comfort zone (MY Mass time) and decide on a schedule that will be ours for a long time. One of the realities that we need to remember is that Mass is a sacrament and a privilege that we are gifted with by the presence and ordination of the Church's priest. The Mass is not a convenience that meets my needs. We will be losing three Masses from the present schedule of nine. Please pray that all of us will be blessed by the decision that is made.






