

Second Sunday of Lent February 25, 2018

What does it mean to be "for" someone? We're often "for" a particular sports team (mine happens to be the 2011 World Champion St. Louis Cardinals - go Redbirds!), declaring our allegiance by wearing team jerseys, sporting logo-embroidered hats, or even painting our faces or bodies. We can be "for" a specific political candidate, displaying signs in our yard. Usually when we're "for" someone or something, we're against someone or something else. A competition is occurring.

Yet when a pregnant woman monitors everything she eats, drinks, or takes into her body because it will affect her unborn child, isn't she "for" her baby? When a tutor spends extra time ensuring a student understands his homework, isn't he "for" this young man? There's no competition, no race to the finish. It's simply someone pouring forth and living selflessly for someone else.

So when we hear Saint Paul claim in today's second reading that "God is for us," we should take pause and recognize the power of this truth. The almighty God, Lord of all the universe, is for us. Us sinners. Us frail, broken humans. God wants to give selflessly to us and to unceasingly pour out love to us. God's most profound gift is revealed in today's Gospel through Jesus' transfiguration. We, like the disciples, are awed at Jesus' glorious nature, and we are given a glimpse of our own transfiguration in eternal life. Our God is so "for" us that he has transformed our death and given us the precious gift of eternal life.

With this vision of glory always before us, our Lenten journey can be one of deep trust in God. Saint Paul said it best: "If God is for us, who can be against us?"

We truly have nothing to fear.






