



To: The Faithful of the Diocese of London

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Today, Ascension Sunday, we listen to the passage in the Gospel of Mark in which Jesus commissions his disciples: "Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation" (Mk 16:15). After he ascends to the Father, his disciples "went out and proclaimed the good news everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the message by the signs that accompanied it" (Mk 16:20). Next week is Pentecost Sunday. The whole Church will join in prayer for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit that we, like the early disciples, will be turned into bold and courageous heralds of God's wondrous deeds.

Four years ago, I established a task force to look into the Future of Pastoral Care in the Faith Communities of the Diocese of London. It proposed a 'Family of Parishes' model. The excellent work done by the task force will help our parishes to be vibrant and active in the Church's mission of evangelization - the proclamation of the Good News of Jesus.

Now that the task force has completed its mandate, I have established a diocesan commission to build on the work that has already been done. The commission will oversee the implementation and development of Families of Parishes that are oriented on our mission of evangelization. It will assist parishes in the realization of the goals of the 'Pastoral Plan for the Diocese of London'. It will help us especially: to enter into a close, personal relationship with Jesus and become intentional disciples (Goal #1), to minister with justice and compassion to the wounded and marginalized (Goal #3), to have vibrant liturgies in our parishes (Goal #4) and to promote continuing formation of pastoral leadership - priests, deacons and lay ecclesial ministers (Goal #5).

The commission will use the different media to communicate, so that we can be more effective in our mission of evangelization. In the weeks ahead, there will be a series of bulletin inserts that will explain the different aspects of this mission.

Our most important task is the commitment of each of us to prayer. I urge you to join together in prayer that we the baptized - you and I - support one another in growing closer to Jesus. Today, as we celebrate the Lord's ascension, I invite you to reflect on Jesus' commission to the first disciples. It is our mission. May we, through our words and deeds, go out and proclaim the Gospel with boldness and courage, inviting others to experience the joy of meeting Jesus. We implore the help of our diocesan Patron, our Blessed Mother under the title of the Immaculate Conception, and ask God to bring to completion the good work he has begun in us (cf. Phil 1:6).

RCIA: why year-round is better (Part one)

When some parish RCIA teams think about the catechumenate, they think about a teaching schedule. On their websites and in their interviews with seekers, the schedule is what is presented as the way to become Catholic. For example:

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a program that welcomes adults into our Catholic community. RCIA classes are held Tuesday nights beginning in September. Catechumens (those not baptized) and candidates (Catholics that have not completed the three sacraments of initiation and people from other Christian denominations who have been validly baptized) are received into the Church at the Easter Vigil. These classes will assist people in developing a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and his church.

If I were a brand new seeker, this would tell me that you Catholics have a kind of school that will teach me how to be Catholic. And that school takes place every Tuesday night for about eight or nine months. A lot of parishes operate on this model, and a lot of them do a really good job at it. This model is helpful to some people. But it is not the RCIA. The classroom only model falls short of what RCIA is all about. As Pope Francis tells us our task is to form lifelong disciples - people who actually stick around after Easter and who "take up this missionary impulse...to go forth to everyone without exception...above all the poor and the sick, those who are usually despised and overlooked" (Pope Francis) "We've always done it this way" is not a strategy.

Pope Francis teaches us: "Pastoral ministry in a missionary key seeks to abandon the complacent attitude that says: We have always done it this way. I invite everyone to be bold and creative in this task of rethinking the goals, structures, style and methods of evangelization in their respective communities. Pastoral ministry in a missionary style is not obsessed with the disjointed transmission of a multitude of doctrines to be insistently imposed. RCIA teams must abandon the "We have always done it this way" attitude. —Pope Francis (Joy of the Gospel, 33, 35)

If the pope is teaching us that we have to stop obsessing over transmitting doctrine and that we have to stop doing things the way we are doing them just because "we have always done it this way," what then are we supposed to learn about establishing and maintaining an effective RCIA process?

Ponder this - "People are initiated into Christ, not Catholicism" (See Part two of this article next week)
