

Below is a special message from Fr. Peter Poel. He was Associate Pastor at St. Ursula Church.

Dear Friends in the Diocese of London:



As many of you will have seen in the Diocesan Pastoral Appointments and Changes, I am going to enter novitiate with the Capuchins.

Some will be familiar with the Capuchins, who are a branch of the Franciscan "family tree". They live a shared life of prayer and fraternity. They work in a variety of ministries, which include parish ministry and outreach ministries to the sick, the poor and the marginalized. In our diocese, they are located in Blenheim and London.

Since November, I have been blessed to have been welcomed into their home in London, near Sherwood Forest Mall, for a time of "lived discernment" as I considered joining their community. The whole process of discernment really began about a year ago, although I have felt drawn to the Franciscan way of life for quite a while. Still, I was surprised to be experiencing this calling within my call to the priesthood.

I have decided, with Bishop Fabbro's gracious permission, to enter into the Capuchin Novitiate - a year of formation in the spirituality and way of life of the community. At the end of that year, if I decide to continue with the Capuchins (and they'll have me!), I will make First Profession. Final Profession would take place two or three years later. Novitiate takes place near Santa Ynez, in Central California (which isn't too hard to take!). I will be leaving to go there by the middle of July. When I return, I will meet with the Provincial Minister of the Capuchins to discuss a suitable placement. He will assign me to one of the three areas where the Capuchins of Central Canada are established: London, Toronto or Winnipeg.

So this is a big change and one which I am simultaneously excited and somewhat anxious about. I will certainly miss the wonderful relationships and constant support which I have experienced in this diocese. Thank you all!

In the meantime, I will be continuing my Diocesan ministries until the end of June.

Please keep me in your prayers.

The Chatham Catholic Family of Parishes (Blessed Sacrament, St. Agnes, St. Joseph, St. Ursula) invites any families of school-aged children (age 7-17) who have not received the Sacraments of Initiation but are interested in pursuing the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation to contact the parish. The pastoral staff are more than happy to help you and your child(ren) enter into a time of discernment and preparation if you want them to become a part of the Catholic faith community.

This journey of faith formation is called the Rite of Christian Initiation Adapted for Children (grades 2-6) and Teens (grades 7-12). These are parish-based programs which require children to attend classes. Various lessons on the teachings of the Catholic faith are presented to help your child journey in faith.

This faith journey is for:

- •Children entering into grades 2-6 in September who have not been baptized
- •Teens entering into grade 7-12 in September who have not been baptized
- •Children or teens who have been baptized in another Christian denomination other than Roman Catholic

Each family's spiritual needs are individual and unique. Therefore care will be taken to assess and find out what your family's distinct needs may be for your child. As parents, you are the first and most crucial model of faith to your child. We, as a faith community, hope to be a partner with you in helping your child grow spiritually.
