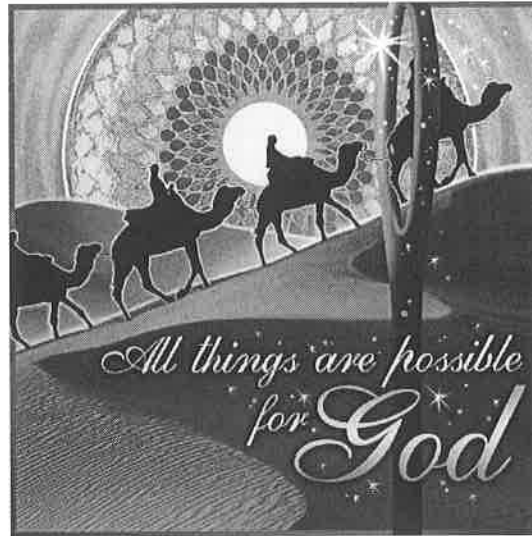

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### OUTREACH FOR HUNGER DRIVE FOR CHATHAM CATHOLIC FAMILY OF PARISHES

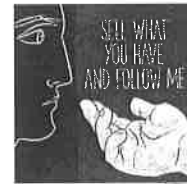

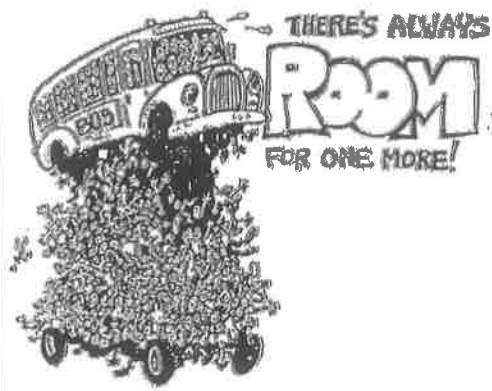
