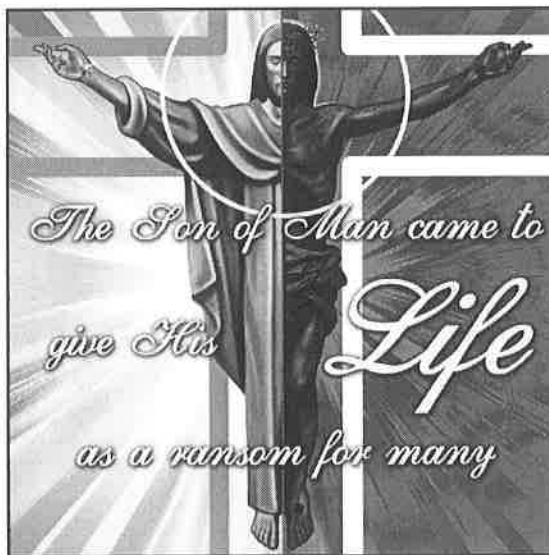

The Priests Study Days were filled with pastoral input but more importantly a chance to catch up with my brother priests and spend time with them. I was part of the Bishop's presentation to the priests and Fr. Dufrainmont and I presented to those present the work we have been a part of in being the Pioneer Pastors of the Family of Parishes. Our reports and sharing were well received and priests thanked us for sharing how things have been progressing. I did not realize that giving such an address would be exhausting but it was. Perhaps it was the nervous energy that I experienced prior to the talk but I felt that the task was well done and the Bishop was very happy with what we did.

Father Don is in Israel and I told him that I will pray for two things for his time on pilgrimage - first that he will find peace in walking in the footsteps of Jesus. For the Lord has said - "come to me all you who are heavy burdened" - and I pray that the Lord will give him an appreciation of all he experiences and how much the Lord loves him. Second prayer is that his experience of the Holy Land will deepen his spiritual understanding of Scripture and allow the experience to deepen his love of the salvation story he will share with us.

This Thursday I will be singing with three priests at the Bishop's dinner in Windsor. Father John Comiskey, Father David Butler and Father Eugene Roy will perform with me. You might remember that six of sang in London as the Vocati. We shrank in number due to commitments but we will do our best to entertain the people present and show the priesthood in a positive light.

REFLECTION

There is a common expression: "Too much information!" We usually use it when people tell us details about their lives that we don't want or need to know. Today, when James and John ask Jesus a simple question, making their request for places of honor in the kingdom, a simple answer might have been in order. Instead, as he often does, Jesus answers a question with a question; today it's about drinking the cup of suffering. Then, once the others are indignant over James and John's outrageous request, he proceeds to give them what may have been "too much information" for followers who were simply interested in the pursuit of glory. But this information, though it can sometimes seem "too much" for us, is essential for our lives as disciples. In Isaiah, in Hebrews, and in Mark today, we learn this information. It is in suffering, in weakness, in self-giving service to others, that we come to understand the kingdom. It is the information we need to find our place and come to be honored in the reign of God.

NOTE FROM RODGER

We have begun to include the monthly and Year To Date (YTD) "basic" financials by Parish Site and comparison to the previous year. These numbers do not include long term loan debt or loan funds on deposit with Diocese. Those numbers will be inserted next month on a separate notation.

PRE-AUTHORIZED DEBIT (PAD)
